Campbell my lawful Executors, to all intents and purposes to execute this my last Will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every Part and Clause thereof. hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made.

I Samuel B. Andrews of the County of Bladen and State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind and memory do this the 26th day of March in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner following - viz

"First"

I give and bequeath to my two sons William Samuel Andrews and Edwin Franklin Andrews my two plantations Namah and Porters Creek with all the adjoining lands which I now possess. (There is now a division line) well marked between the two plantations which I wish to be established as the division line. It is further more my wish that the above mentioned plantations should be valued by the same persons who may value my other lands and should the valuation not be equal then they having the Greater must pay over to the lesser (amount) so as to make each one of the children girls and boys share equal to the other of my Real Estate.

"Second"

I give and bequeath to my daughters Mary Eliza Sophia Lucy and Lavinia the whole of the balance of my lands which I now possess to be equally divided among them.

"Third"

I give and bequeath to my son Edwin Franklin Andrews a certain negro boy the name of Simon the son of Sylva for his care and attention to my business after the death of his Mother.

I also give to my son Edwin Franklin the whole of Mts Register which I now have or may hereafter acquire.

"Fourth"

I give and bequeath to my son William the Encyclopedia Americana. I also give my son William the whole of my medical Books.

"Fifth"

I give and bequeath to my wife Flora Ann Andrews Fifty Dollars in Cash.

"Sixth"

I wish all just demands against my Estate to be settled

"Seventh"

I give and bequeath the whole of the of my Estate of whatever species and

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divided equally share and share alike between my children

Eighth I wish my children liberally educated should I leave property enough to do so after paying all my just debts.

Ninth I hereby make and ordain my friends Geo^d John Owen and Isaac Wright Esq^r both of the County of Bladen Executors to this my last Will and Testament

As it was expressly understood between my Wife and myself in reference to a marriage agreement entered into in June 1836, previous to our marriage will show that she was not to expect or receive any part of my property after my death, which will I hope be a sufficient justification for my not making a more liberal provision for her.

Whereas I Sam^l. D. Andrews of the County of Bladen and State of North Carolina having made and duly executed my last Will and Testament in writing bearing date the 26th day of March 1837.

Now I do hereby declare this present writing to be as a codicil to my said Will and direct and direct the same to be annexed thereto, and taken as part thereof.

And I do hereby give and bequeath to Lucy Brown daughter of George W. Brown a Part of my Negro Girl named Nancy (the daughter of Charles Brown) provided nevertheless that should

the said George W. Brown have more children in law - girl Nedlock, then it is my wish that the said Negro girl Nancy, and her increase should be equally divided among the whole of the lawful children of the above mentioned George W. Brown share and share alike

It is furthermore my wish that should the said George W. Brown die without issue or should he have a child or children and they die without issue, that the said Negro girl Nancy and her increase to be returned and equally divided among my children.

I give and bequeath all my Books of every description to my two sons, William S. and C. D. Andrews.

I, Samuel D. Andrews, also annex this as a Codicil to my Will bearing date 26th of March 1837, and direct that after my Negroes are valued, that Sam and his wife Lucy and their children be given to my son William S. Andrews as part of his lot, and that Venus and her wife Sybil, and their children be given to my son Edwin Franklin Andrews as part of his lot.

And I further direct that my much esteemed Aunt, Ann Brown, be provided for Comfortably for money derived from my estate, provided she does not wish either of my sons.

And I give and bequeath to my wife Eliza Andrews, two Cows and Calves and two Sows and also my son Edwin S. Andrews has agreed to the place whereon I reside as his home.

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I Furthermore give and bequeath to him the same Cured Hamak with the adjoining lands on the East side of Carvers Creek. and to my son William S. Andrew I give and bequeath the tract land Porters Creek on the North side of said Creek and the adjoining lands.

I give and bequeath unto my wife Anna Jane Singletary all my lands lying in the forsaide State and County to her use and also for the support of my children until my son Saml. Singletary will arrive to the age of twenty one years. and then an equal division between my wife and children

I want my wife to hold the Part of the lands including the homere.

I also give unto my wife For and my Horse Old Cows and Calves Fifteen head of Year old Hogs. Fourteen pigs and two Cows. Three head of sheep. All my household and Kitchen Furniture my Plantation Tools. all my Corn and Bacon in hand and in the Bush. Apples. Peas. and Prage of the same. my Children to hold

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for my wife during her widowhood and if she becomes ungovernable I want her to live with out the notes and money I want laid out for my Negroes to the best advantage for my children and let my wife have the use of such negroes until the youngest child is raised. The residue of my stock I wish to be sold at public auction.

I have forty barrels of Tar at Elizabethtown I want it sold to the best advantage at private sale.

I nominate and appoint Elias Monroe and John M. Lenoir. Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills or Wills by me made at any time.

This 21st Day of January A.D. 1840

My beds and furniture I give to my wife and also the Family Bible. Three Books in four volumes containing Encyclopaedia I want them sold.

I publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament.
