

# RECORD OF WILLS.

"In the name of God" I Samuel M. Richardson being weak in body but of dispositive mind and memory do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following.

I give and bequeath to my beloved Brother Haynes Richardson in trust for the proper use and benefit of my beloved mother Mary Corman during her natural life a negro woman named Induce and at her death the said negro woman shall become the property of my said Brother Haynes Richardson. I also give to my beloved Mother One hundred dollars a year to be paid her yearly during her life by my Executor to this my last will and testament.

I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved Brother Haynes Richardson subject first to the payment of all my just debts and secondly to the accomplishment of all other bequests made in this my last will and testament to him and his lawful heirs for and all my property Real Personal and Perishable.

I give and bequeath to dear Sister Sarah Corman, Brother Thomas Corman and Sister Caroline Corman Five Hundred dollars each to be paid them whenever they severally become twenty one years of age by my Brother Haynes Richardson and provided either of the above said Sarah Thomas or Caroline shall die before they become twenty one years of age or leaving no issue then in that case it is my desire the before said Five Hundred dollars shall be retained and owned by my Brother Haynes Richardson.

I give and bequeath to my very dearly beloved Anna M. Dyer One Hundred dollars to be deducted out of money due me by her and for which I hold my Brother Haynes notes given for her.

I do constitute and my beloved Brother Haynes Richardson Executor of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 14<sup>th</sup> day of July 1836

This the 29<sup>th</sup> day of December in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and ninety eight I Joseph Cain of Bladen County and State of North Carolina Planter being in perfect mind and memory, and understanding thanks be to God thereof but considering the uncertainty of human life and knowing it is allotted for all men to die do make and obtain this my last will and testament in manner following: that is to say: Testament. Item. As to what worldly estate is given God to bless me with in this world. I give devise and bequeath in the following manner and form.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> "viz" First of all I give unto my half Brother John Cain two shillings Sterling to him and his heirs forever.

Item 2<sup>d</sup> I give unto my half Brother James Cain the sum of two shillings Sterling to him and his heirs forever.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath unto my nephew Joseph Cain the son of Samuel Cain the sum of ten shillings Sterling.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto George Willis Sen<sup>r</sup> of the County of Robeson the sum of ten shillings Sterling to him and his heirs forever.
