 1823 make and publish this my last Will and  
 Testament in manner following that is to say

 God that gave it me and my body to be buried  
 in decent Christian burial at the discretion of  
 my Executors. Regarding this worldly estate which  
 it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and  
 dispose of in the following manner:-

I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife  
 Eliza Reeves the half of my lands wherein I now  
 live and am possessed with and all my stock of  
 cattle and hogs together with my house hold furniture  
 goods and chattels and one cart to be hers and her  
 right.

I give and bequeath to James Reeves Senior the other  
 half of my land, and I hereby make my worthy  
 friend James Reeves Executor of this my Last  
 Will and Testament.
