I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and disannul all & every other former testament, Wills & Legacies & bequeaths & in witness hereof I have in any way before named willed & bequeathed ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will & testament.

Item I give & bequeath unto my ^{loving} wife Mary Mustle White all the remainder of my estate both real and personal during her widowhood & in case she marries a child's part.

Item My will and desire is that my seven daughters Nancy, Ellen, Bridget, Mary, Amelia, Patience and Sarah had an equal part of all my movable estate except my Negroes to them their heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my four sons William, Nathan, Thomas, Alex and Mustle White all my lands and negroes to be equally divided

between them likewise to have and equal part of the movable estate, to them their heirs and assigns forever.

I constitute and ordain my loving wife Mary Musthwhite Executrix and my loving son William Executor of this my last will and Testament.

And I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and disannul all and every former Testament wills Legacies and Executors by me in any way before this time named made and bequeathed revoking and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament.

I also give and bequeath all my personal estate of what kind whatsoever unto my said wife Mary Moore.

And I do hereby appoint said wife Mary Moore Ex-
ecutrix and William Hill and Roger Davis Esquires
Executors of my will.

And I do hereby publish and declare this to be my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made.
