my negro fellow called old Pompey

I give to my well beloved son William Singletary  
and to the heirs of his body forever the plantation  
whereon I now live beginning at the Slave Landing  
Thence down the N.W. River containing three  
hundred and twenty acres be it more or less

Also I give my son William four hundred and  
forty acres joining the same part of my back tract  
on Harrison's Creek, also my negro fellow called  
young Pompey.

I give and bequeath to my son Richard Singletary  
five hundred acres of land known by the name of  
Susan Camps or Stratobys to him and the heirs  
of his body forever

I give to my daughter Elizabeth Singletary widow  
of John Singletary my negro fellow named Charles

I give to my son in law Elkanah Allen six  
shillings proclamation money.

I give to my well beloved wife Joyce Singletary  
my negroes Tom, Jimmy, and Judy during her  
life than I give Tom to my son Richard, Jimmy to  
and Judy to be divided between my sons William  
and Richard.

I likewise give unto my wife Joyce my household  
furniture and stuff during her life the to be divided  
between my sons Benjamin, William and Richard

I do constitute make and ordain my son  
William Singletary and my nephew William Sutor  
my sole executors of this my last will and testament

And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and  
disannull all and every other former testament  
will, legacies, rights and executors by me in any  
ways before named willed and bequeathed  
ratifying and confirming this and no other  
to be my last will and testament

of North Carolina being my sick and weak in  
body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be  
given unto God therefor having unto mind the  
mortality of my body and knowing that it is  
appointed for all men to die so make and ordain  
this my last will and Testament that is to say  
privately and first of all

I give and recommend my soul into the hands  
of God that gave it and for my body I recommend  
it to the earth to be buried with a Christian like  
and decent manner at the discretion of my Ex-  
ecutors nothing doubting but at the general res-  
urrection I shall receive the same again by the  
mighty power of God. and as touching such  
worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to  
bless me in this life. I give devise and assign  
of the same in the following manner and form  
hereunto — It is my will and I do order that  
in the first place all my just debts and funeral  
charges be paid and satisfied

I give unto my Son John Storm one hundred  
acres of land whereon I dwell now. and any other  
working tools except plantation tools. one Rife  
Gun. and one Double barre Gun. one over and

bottles. Three and a half yards of Broadcloth

I give unto my daughter Margaret Stom three  
Cows and Calves. One year old. Rifer. two Pewter  
dishes three plates. three Cups. one Iron Pot one  
Smoothing Iron. one Woolen wheel one Rifle Gun

I give my daughter Mary three Cows and  
Calves. and a year old Rifer two Pewter dishes  
one Basin. three plates. three Cups. one Iron  
Pot one Lable Skinner and flesh Fork. also  
Shord and Tonge. one Smoothing Iron. Spying Gun  
and Skillet one flat wheel. one hundred acres of  
land Cedar Swamp to be sold and equally divided  
between Margaret Stom and Mary Stom

I give unto my loving Wife all the residue  
of my Moreable estate and liberty to live on the  
Land whereupon I dwelt now during her midwifery.  
whatever debt are due to me my Will is that my  
just debts be paid. out of it and the residue to be  
laid out in Clothing. and necessaries for the use  
of my family.

And I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty  
Friends John Lock and John Moore. of the County  
aforesaid Farmers. and make void all former wills  
by me at any time made.

In the name of God "Amen"  
I Hugh Haddall of the County of Bladen and Province  
of North Carolina being sick and weak out of sound  
mind and memory at this time do make and re-  
ordain this to be my last Will and Testament. viz  
following.

It is my will and desire that my body be  
decetfully buried at the discretion of my Executors  
hereafter mentioned and as to my worldly affairs  
I give devise and dispose of them as follows

Imprimis - It is my will and desire that all  
my just debts be paid and satisfied.

It is also my Will and desire that my aforesaid  
son Hayes Haddall have my plantation on Prince  
George Creek on the North East in the State of  
North Carolina with the swamp below Ledges and whatever  
lands come to one by and in right of my beloved wife  
Mary Haddall. allotted to the aforesaid Hayes Haddall  
to him and his heirs forever. also the corner lot  
in Wilmington. corner on Mr Chapman next line  
also the land called Posters Neck. in Bladen County  
with one third of all my goods and profits in  
trade after drawing out Eight hundred proclamation  
money to my beloved wife. which is to be paid into  
her hands also

I give and devise unto him one fourth of all the  
negroes that I shall die possessed of to him and  
his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my second son Hugh  
Haddall. my plantation called Bell fort in Bladen  
County. together with my plantation called Plantation  
with the lightwood lands adjoining both together  
with the mills whether saw or grist mill and other  
landed properties belonging to the same as also the  
lightwood lands lately taken up back of Plantation  
and the lake to him and his heirs forever. also one  
third of all my goods and profits in trade after  
drawing out Eight hundred proclamation money. to  
my beloved wife. which is to be paid into her hand  
aforesaid. also the house in Wilmington formerly  
belonging to John Sampson Esquire and also one family
