my negro fellow called old Pompey,

Item I give to my well beloved son William Singletary
and to the heirs of his body forever the plantation
whereon I now live beginning at the Star Landing
thence down the N.W. River containing three
hundred and twenty acres be it more or less.

Also I give my son William four hundred and
forty acres joining the same part of my back tract
on Harrison's Creek; also my negro fellow called
young Pompey.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Richard Singletary
five hundred acres of land known by the name of
Susan Camps or Strabogel, to him and the heirs
of his body forever.

Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Singletary widow
of John Singletary my negro fellow named Charles.

Item I give to my son in law Elkanah Allen five
shillings proclamation money.

Item I give to my well beloved wife Joyce Singletary
my negroes Tom, Jimmy, and Judy during her
life then I give Tom to my son Richard, Jimmy to
and Judy to be divided between my sons William
and Richard.

I likewise give unto my wife Joyce my household
furniture and stuff during her life she to be divided
between my sons Benjamin, William and Richard.

Item I do constitute make and ordain my son
William Singletary and my nephew William Satter
my sole Executors of this my last will and Testament.

And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and
disannull all and every other former Testament
Wills, Legacies, rights and executors by me in any
ways before named willed and bequeathed
ratifying and confirming this and no other
to be my last will and Testament.

I Wanda Horn of Bladen County in the province
of North Carolina being my sick and weak in
body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be
given unto God therefore passing unto much the
mortality of my body and knowing that it is
appointed for all men to die do make and ordain
this my last Will and Testament that is to say
principally and first of all

I give and recommend my soul unto the hands
of God that gave it and for my body I recommend
it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like
and decent manner at the discretion of my Ex-
ecutors nothing doubting but at the general re-
urrection I shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God. and as touching such
worldly estate wherein it hath pleased God to
bless me in this life. I give devise and dispose
of the same in the following manner and form
Imprimis — It is my will and I do order that
in the first place all my just debts and funeral
charges be paid and satisfied.

Item I give unto my son John Horn one hundred
acres of land wherein I dwell now and all my
working tools except plantation tools. one Rifle
Gun, and one Sawed bar Gun, one Carriage

one two year old Steer. one Saddle one Case and bottles. Three and a half yards of Broadcloth

Item

I give unto my daughter Margaret Storn three Cows and Calves. one Year old. Rifer, two Paster dishes three plates. three Cups. one Iron Pot one Smoothing Iron. one Woolen wheel one Rifle Gun

Item

I give my daughter Mary three Cows and Calves and a year old Rifer two Paster dishes one Basin three plates. three Cups. one Iron Pot one Ledge Stimmer and flesh fork. five Chord and Tonge. one Smoothing Iron. Spring Saw and Skillet one flay wheel. one hundred acres of land Cedar Swamp to be sold and equally divided between Margaret Storn and Mary Storn

Item

I give unto my loving Wife all the residue of my moveable estate and Liberty to live on the land whereupon I dwell now during her widowhood whatever debt are due to me my Will is that my just debts be paid. out of it and the residue to be laid out in clothing. and necessaries for the use of my family.

And I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty Friends. John Lock and John Woods. of the County aforesaid. farmers, and make void all former wills by me at any time made.

In the estate of Robt "Amos"

I. Hugh Waddell of the County of Bladen and Province of North Carolina being sick and weak and of sound mind and memory at this time do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament, viz following.

It is my will and desire that my body be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned and as to my worldly affairs I give devise and dispose of them as follows

Imprimis - It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid and satisfied.

It is also my will and desire that my eldest son Haynes Waddell have my plantation on Pine Grove Creek on the North East in Curstons County with the Swamp below Lizies and whatever lands come to me by and in right of my beloved wife Mary Waddell. mortised to the aforesaid Haynes Waddell to him and his heirs forever. also the Corner Lot in Wilmington. whereon Mrs Annam now lives also the land called Porters Neck, in Bladen County with one third of all my goods and profits in trade after drawing out. Eight hundred Proclamation money to my beloved Wife. which is to be paid into his hands also

I give and devise unto him one fourth of all the negroes that I shall die possessed of to him and his heirs forever.

Item

I give and bequeath unto my second son Hugh Waddell. my plantation called Bellfont in Bladen County together with my plantation called Cranston with the lightwood lands adjoining both together with the Mills whether Saw or Grist Seate. and other landed properties belonging to the same as also the lightwood lands lately taken up. back of Cranston and the Lake to him and his heirs forever. also one third of all my goods and profits in trade after drawing out. Eight hundred Proclamation money. to my beloved Wife. which is to be paid into his hand aforesaid. also the Corner in Wilmington formerly belonging to John Sampson. Equally as also one fourth
