I, Hagar Atkinson of the County and State above mentioned, being of sound mind and realizing the uncertainty of life do hereby make and declare this my last will and testament:

1: My executor hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial and pay all funeral expenses together with all my just debts, out of the first money which may come into his hands, belonging to my estate.

2: I give and devise to my daughter Martha Beasley the tract of land on which I now reside containing about 13 acres, to her and to her heirs and assigns, to hold to her and her heirs in fee simple, I further give and bequeath to her all the residue of my estate.

3: I give to my daughter Alice, wife of Frank Green the sum of one dollar.

4: I give to my son, Albert Gray the sum of one dollar.

5: I give to my son James Gray the sum of one dollar.

6: I hereby constitute and appoint C. Ed. Taylor my lawful executor to execute this my last will and testament.
