In the Name of God Amen - I Thomas Holden of the State of North Carolina and County of Brunswick being of sound and disposing mind and memory. Considering the brevity of life and the certainty of death. Do make sign, seal, publish and declare the following to be my last Will and Testament.

1st My will is that my wife Emeline have after my death all my lands and personal property during her widowhood and that after her death or second marriage my two sons Thomas Jefferson and Henry Munroe shall have all my lands and personal property, provided, they shall pay to my two daughters Elizabeth Catherine and Sarah Jane Seventy five dollars each within two years after the death or second marriage of my wife otherwise the same shall be equally divided between the four above named children.

2nd My will is that my daughter Virginia D. Johnson have one dollar as I have given her lands by and heretofore, in testimony whereof I hereby sign, seal, publish and declare this paper-writing to be my last Will and Testament, this the 29th day of September 1886.

And these deponents further sayeth, that at the said time, when the said testator subscribed his name to the said last Will as aforesaid, and at the time of the deponents subscribing their names as attesting witnesses thereto as aforesaid, the said Thomas Holden was of sound mind and memory, of full age to execute a Will and was not under any restraint to the knowledge, information or belief of these deponents, and further these deponents say not.
