viz^t all that part of the West side of the Marsh fork
of Peable Creek or Mill Creek bounded by the several
Landers of the said Creek and on the North of Hall's
Land and of East of Williams Land Thence bounded
by Robert Perkins line for the valuable consideration
of one Hundred pound of Good and merchantable
Tobacco for each Acre of said contents to be the same
more or less one Pound and Weight to be paid yearly
till paid, to be delivered in the bulk and on the said
Payment being made the said John Dowl doth bind
himself his Heirs or Executors to the said Elisha Rowark his
Heirs and assigns in the full and full sum of Five
Hundred pound that he said Rowark shall have a Good
and quiete Deed for said Land at time of Consummation
as above mentioned and the said Elisha Rowark
doth also bind himself in the full sum of Three Hundred
pounds to pay the Tobacco as above said, To all which
the Parties have set their hands and seals interchangeably
