

Last Will and Testament of Jacob Setzer.

In the name of God, amen.

I, Jacob Setzer of the County of Catawba, do hereby declare & publish this as my last will and testament in words as follows.

251

Item First I will & bequeath to my beloved wife Patsy Setzer for the term of her life my home tract of land whereon I now live, and after her death or remarriage the said tract of land is to go to my youngest son George Edie Setzer and his heirs forever.

Item After the death of myself and wife or her remarriage I direct my executors hereinafter named to provide out of my estate a sufficient amount for the due education of my son George Edie Setzer; and I also will & devise to him a two year old black mare & mule. I will & devise to my wife Patsy to be paid out of the stock crop provisions and money on hand her years support & provisions at my death to be set apart and allowed by proper commissioners to be appointed by the proper Court.

Item I hereby direct and will that all the remainder of my estate both real ^{and personal} after my death be divided equally among all ^{namely the children} children of my son Marcus S. Setzer, William Setzer, the child of my son Henry Setzer whose name is Laura and married to Albert Carpenter and Noah Setzer, William Setzer, Patrick Setzer, Henry Setzer. The children of my daughter Mahala who married Robert Snipe, Anne wife of Freeman Jones. Each of the above children to account for all such advances I have made to them either by deeds in land or in cash or other property heretofore given them, as well appear in full by my books of accounts to which reference is hereby made.

Item I direct that two hundred dollars shall be paid out of personal estate by my executors for the education of my youngest son George Edie

Setzer as directed in a former item of this will. I also give and devise to my wife Patsy two hundred dollars in cash in addition to her years allowance and all the household and kitchen furniture that she brought to my house.

Lastly, I hereby appoint my friend Dr. George C. McNeil the executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have this 3rd day of December 1884 set my hand and affixed my seal.
