The last will and testament of Daniel Sanderson exhibited and proved at term 1822

State of Virginia in the name of God Amen -
Cumberland County } I Daniel Sanderson Planter of the County aforesaid Do make and constitute this to be my last will and testament. First of all I recommend my immortal Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and as for my worldly goods I lend and give in the following manner. Nam. I give the whole of my Land to be equally divided between my four Sons John James Thomas and Tyse Sanderson.

Nam. I lend to my wife Negroes Rachel and Charles and Ringo (during her life or widowhood) and after his death or marriage I give the above named Negroes to be equally divided between my four Sons John James Thomas Tyse

Nam. I give to my wife her choice of six cows

and calves out of my stock and the remaine to be sold for six months credit and divided ^{equally} between all of my children Nam. I give to my wife all of my sheep also I give her all of my hogs except them on the tinker which is to be sold and the money to be equally divided between all of my children

Nam. I give to my wife the horse named Prince and mare named Philis and my riding chair and harness also all of my corn except twenty bbl which is to be sold and divided between all of my children also I give all of my pork and Bacon to my wife

except one thousand wale which is to be sold and divided between all of my children, also I give to my wife all the land except the large tract which is to be sold and equally divided between all of my children, also I give to my wife all of my farming tools, also I give to my wife all of my house hold and kitchen furniture, also I give to my wife my steers cart

Nam. I give to my daughter Polly a Negro man by the name of Whmill and one Nigro girl named Lydia

Nam. My will and desire is that my Nigro Sarah and her increase be equally divided between all of my children

Nam. I give my two Nigro Boys Luke and March to be equally divided between my four sons John James Thomas Tyse Sanderson

Nam. My two young Horses to be sold and the money to be equally divided between all of my children also my third of schooner lively to be sold and equally divided between all of my children and my land I give to my wife and all the property belonging to me that is not mentioned in this my will to be sold and equally divided between all of my children.

Nam. My will and desire is in this my last will that my wife be in full possession of all my land (during her life or widowhood) provided she keep her children clear of charge also I give all

of my money and notes after pay my Debts out of them to my wife

I do nominate and appoint my beloved wife to be my whole and sole Executor At this my last will and testament In Testamoney hereoff I have here unto set my hand and seal this 27th of February 1822

The Last will and testament of James Gray deceased, exhibited May term 1823

In the name of God amen: James Gray of the County of Currituck and State of North Carolina being sick and weak of body, but of sound disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament to be I give unto my wife Mary Gray one negro woman named Sue, to her and her assigns forever. I lend to my wife Mary Gray all my property within doors and without doors during her widowhood. I give and bequeath unto all my lawful as all my Lands and tenements and property of all kind, whatsoever belongs to me, to be equily divided between them. I constitute, make and ordain my wife Mary Gray, Executor and my brother William Gray my executor to this my Last will and testament Resolving and making void all other will, wills or bequests what soever. In Testament whereunto I have set my hand and seal the seventeen day of February in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred and twenty two Signed Sealed pronounced and declared by the testator to be his last will and testament in presence of us

The Last will and Testament of Mr David Jones deceased Exhibited Feby term 1823

In the name of God Amen. I David Jones of the County of Currituck, North Carolina; weak in body, but of sound mind; do make declare and pronounce this to be my last will and testament. I commend my soul to he who created it my body to be buried by the side of my former wife. I Lend unto my wife, Mary, during her natural life or widowhood, negro woman Love and her two youngest children, Lot and Tom, negro woman Mrs. & child, Milder also negro man Simon; and after her death the two negro women and their children to be sold, and the money equally divided between all my children; the negro man Simon I give after the death of my wife to give to my son Joseph, ductor, one to my wife Mary forever, my linen lot, stool, chair, two bedsteads furniture, Bible, two tables, side board, looking glass, all the Crochery ware and kitchen furniture twenty two hogs first choice at the plantation called Westboys, three Cows, three called Benny two plows, horse cart, yoke of oxen at twenty, and negro girl Sue & three of five barrels of corn. I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary to have the plantation Snow Pine on; upon Currituck; there and to which she is entitled after my death it being her mothers maiden Land, I also give her negro boy back one bed and furniture, secular & book case, all my silver Spoon and watches & the M^r whog my W^m as I should do for E. D. Ferber give to own note of one hundred and eighty dollars or upwards, also all the debts he may owe me, also all my Medical books and stock of medicine, shop furniture, instruments &c. I give and bequeath to my daughter Bridget Elizabeth the Land I bought of the Thomasons ever since Harvey now lives and subject to his wife Life Estate, also my seven and a half land lying in Buchanan Swamp North of William Perkins containing about three hundred acres, also the marsh down on bells Island, also one bed and furniture, also negro boy Alexander and girl Phoebe and two hundred dollar in notes of hand and I nominate W^m E. Ferber the guardian of said daughter B. Elizabeth
