Then was the within will proved in open court by the oaths of Isaac N. Bland one of the subscribing witnesses thereto and at the same time Enoch Alderman the Esqr came into court and qualified as such ordered that the letters issued that for Read & Calk In the name of God Amen. I John Alderman in the County of Duplin and State of North Carolina calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die. do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say. First I consecrate and appoint my beloved wife Ann Alderman and my son Enoch Alderman of the County aforesaid to be my executors to my last will and testament and as touching my worldly estate I give and dispose of the same in the manner and form following & leave to my executors one horse one yoke of oxen, one cowry of land containing sixty acres being and lying on the Needy Branch joining Britian Pond two cows and calver five killable hogs and five doves and pigs to sell to the best advantage as they may think best & proper to satisfy my debts. I bequeath to my son Enoch Alderman twenty more acres of land joining the outside of that I have deeded to him I reserve the use of the upper field on the south side of the Creek to my son Enoch Alderman for the time of six years. I give and bequeath to be equally divided between my two sons James Alderman and Isaac N. Alderman the land as follows Beginning on my son Enoch line twenty yards above the corner on the marsh thence a straight line to the upper edge of the place opened for a road across the creek against the mill. Thence with the upper edge of said road to the river. Thence up said river against a black pine corner in the swamp on the north

side of said creek. Hence with the lines round to my son Enoch  
 line there with it to the beginning supposed to be two hundred  
 acres or the more I also receive the penceage of the house &  
 staying in it for five years Also of the land inclosed by the  
 fence round the house the same terms of time to my son  
 James where he is now living. I leave to my beloved wife  
 Ann Alderman the residue of all my lands during her widow  
 hood. I give unto her my gray horse and colt three cows and  
 calves or yearlings and two heifers six ewes and four lambs  
 four sons and twenty dry hogs sixteen year old all my  
 crop of every kind two beds bedticks and furniture I leave with  
 her during her widow hood all of the rest my house hold and  
 kitchen furniture also two pair cart wheels one riding chair  
 and all (except the Smith tools) of my plantation and working  
 tools I leave my negro man Dacot with my wife Ann Alderman  
 during her widow hood and after that to be sold if she should  
 be delivered of a daughter or daughters they and my daughter  
 that are now borned or the survivors of them I give the money  
 that he pitches to be equally divided amongst them or if she  
 should be delivered of a son or Sons him or them together  
 with my four youngest sons that are now borned or the survivors  
 of them at that time John B. Daniel Mariah B and  
 Hosie. I give the land and the mill that I left to my wife  
 to be equally divided amongst them or three of them that are living  
 at the time I give to my son Isaac N. Alderman my black  
 Smith tools one heifer one steer and four sheep. I give my wife  
 one heifer and a pair of cart wheels that is begun to my son James  
 Alderman and I also give my daughter Mary Blane fifteen  
 dollars to buy feathers the house hold and kitchen furniture  
 that I left to my wife after she is done with. I give to the rest of  
 my daughters that is now borned or may be borned. I leave the  
 residue of my oxen and stock of every kind and another pair  
 of cart wheels to my wife for the use of her self and family  
 and if need bee to sell such part as she my think proper  
 to finish paying my debts and for the support or tuition of  
 my children my gun I leave with her for the use of the family  
 and after she is done with it I give to my son John B. Alderman  
 & witness where of I have hereunto set my

 executors named in the said will came before the Court and  
 qualified as executors thereto according to law and ordered  
 that letters issued according to Just W<sup>m</sup> Dickens C. C.

In the name of God amen. I Henry Allen of the state of North  
 Carolina and County of Duplin being of perfect mind and  
 memory Blessed be God calling to mind the uncertainty of  
 Human life and knowing that it is just appointed for all men  
 Henry to die. Do make and ordain this my last will and testament  
 Allen in manner and words following. I give & command my soul  
 to God that gave it to me and my body to have decent &  
 Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors here after  
 named. Secondly I will and ordain that my Executor do sell  
 so much of the most perishable part of my estate as may be  
 sufficient to discharge all my just debts and funeral charges  
 Thirdly I will and ordain to my son Henry Allen the full  
 forth part of all the young cattle that are born out of my old  
 stock of Cattle to him and his heirs forever. Fourthly I give and  
 bequeath to my two sons Henry Allen and Lavin Allen to be  
 equally divided betwixt them. Sheep and sheeps aside. all the  
 cattle and hogs of my property & like wise all my house furniture  
 and working tools to them and their heirs forever. Fifthly I give  
 and bequeath to my son Williamson Allen twenty shillings  
 currency to him and his heirs forever. Sixthly I give and bequeath  
 to my son Ezekiel Allen twenty shillings to him and his heirs for  
 ever. Seventhly I give and bequeath to my daughter Sabrough King  
 Twenty shillings currency to her and to her heirs forever. Eighthly  
 I give and bequeath to my daughter Ruth Jones Twenty shillings  
 currency to her and her heirs for ever. Ninthly I give and be  
 queath to my daughter Elizabeth Hally twenty shillings Curr
