mind and perfect memory, thanks be to God for the same calling to
mind the certainty of death & feeling and disposition of body and
that my dissolution is not far off do. Ordain and constitute this to
be my last will and testament. Viz In I give and bequeath to my
son William Albertson one shilling. Second I give and bequeath
to my daughter Elizabeth one shilling. Thirdly I give and bequeath
to my son Edward Albertson one shilling. Fourthly I give and bequeath to
my daughter Nancy two hundred acres of land lying between the
merry branch and the north east. Fifthly, I give and bequeath to my
grand daughter Elizabeth Keston one bed and furniture. Sixthly I give
and bequeath to my two grand daughters Catharine Albertson and Polly
Albertson, each one feather bed and furniture and each two cows & calves.
Seventhly I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Sally Albertson
one bed and furniture. Eighthly I leave all the rest of my property
to be divided as follows between Polly Keston, Nancy Windsor
David Albertson Sarah Smith equally to be divided between

two make and ordain this my last will and testament, in
mannor and form as follows that is to say. First I recommend

my soul to God and my body to the earth to be
buried in a christian like manner at the discretion of my
Executors and to bestow my worldly estate. I dispose of
that in manner following to wit. First I give and bequeath
to my wife Mary Busley during her natural life that part
of land beginning on the east side of alligator pond on
the line which I the testator bought from Jacob Mathis to run
thence a straight line to the old field pond thence a straight line
to the run of Mullens creek ten poles below my mill. thence
down the run of Mullens creek to the lower line of my land.
Thence the various courses of my land to a lightwood. thence
on the south side of the red cat pond thence as that line to the beginning
and after her decease to my son Austin Busley also one bed and fur-
niture four cows and calves the gray horse and riding chair one
negro boy Jim^d during her life one negro boy name Willis to be run for
the term of ten years - 2d I give to son Bass Busley that part of
my land bounded as follows Beginning at a light wood on the west
side of alligator pond and running thence as the line laid off-
