 name of God amen. I, Mary Long of Quincy, in the County of Waffay, the
 Widow of the late Colonel Nicholas Long dec^d - being weak in health & body - but
 of sound and perfect mind and memory - praise be therefore given to Almighty
 God do make and ordain this my present ^{last} Will and Testament revoking explicitly
 and expressly all others heretofore made by me - First & principally I commend
 my soul into the hands of Almighty God Hoping through the merits, blood
 and passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have full and free pardon and
 forgiveness of all my sins and to inherit everlasting life - And my Body I
 Commit to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors -
 Herin after named - and as touching the Disposition of all such temporal Estate
 as it has pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I give and dispose thereof
 as followeth - First I give and demise to my grand Children Margaret
 Maria Bassett Stith, Mary Parinia Bassett Stith, Mary M^c Hinnie
 Bassett Stith, William Anderson Stith, Allost Augustus Bassett Stith, Martha
 Elizabeth Long Stith, Nicholas Long Stith, Sarah, Frances, Washington Stith,
 Joanna Virginia Churchill Stith, & Bassett, Mostly Marissa Stith Sons &
 daughters of Bassett Stith and Mary his Wife - and to them & their heirs forever
 as Tenants in Common share & share alike, in equal proportions all my real
 Estate or Trust of land situate lying & being on Roanoke River containing by

old Merrim - Now I give and bequeath unto Rutchen G. Burton Esq. the
following Negroes in trust to and for the only proper use and behoof of my
daughter Mary Stitt, wife of Bassett Stitt, to and for the several uses, trusts &
intentions and purposes herein after declared & mentioned, To wit Negro man
Chauncy & Sarah his Wife, Bernette, Lavinia, Abraham, Solomon, Moses, Shadrach,
Matthias, Minny and her son Mary Annaca and her two Children, Harry
and Ned Corron, and a Girl by the name of Judah and one by the name of
Lacretia, old Blacksmith Jam. and my old Woman Perry - That my said Trustee
Rutchen G. Burton, hold the forenamed Negroes - his Executors & administrators
in trust for and to the use of the said Mary Stitt for her support & for the
maintaining of herself and family during her natural life and to support the
of said Negroes. & their increase to remain in the possession of my said
Daughter Mary Stitt, or if necessary for the better support & maintenance
of my said Daughter and her family, then the said Rutchen G. Burton his
Executors and administrators to hire out all or any of the aforesaid given Negroes

For the most they will bring at public auction (and the said Hutchins G. Burton
his Executors and administrators - shall pay the hire, profits & expenses thereof
to the said Mary Still, to her only proper use and behoof and purpose, but
the said negroes shall not be hired out by the said Hutchins G. Burton or his
Executors or administrators unless by the free will and consent of my said daughter
Mary Still, and if hired out only to such person or persons as she shall by any
writing under her hand direct and appoint - nor shall the money for the hire
of the said negroes be paid to any person or persons unless by the direction of the
said Mary Still in manner of record - and after the decease of my said daughter
Mary Still I give and bequeath the aforesaid negroes and their increase to the
Children of my said daughter Mary Still wife of Baptist Still to-wit: Mary
Maria Baptist Still, Mary Savina Baptist Still, Mary McMinie Baptist Still
William Anderson Still, & Elbert Augustus Baptist Still, Martha Elizabeth Long
Still, Nicholas Long Still, Sarah Frances Washington Still, Fanny Virginia
Churchill Still. And Baptist Mosely Harrison Still, as tenants in common to be
equally divided between them share and share alike - and it is my request & desire
that my Trustee the said Hutchins G. Burton his Executors or administrators
execute his trust by delivering or causing the aforesaid negroes to be delivered to
my aforesaid Grand Children for the purposes aforesaid - I also give to the
said Hutchins G. Burton Esq. upon the like limitations, uses & trusts herein

I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Mary
McMinn of my Gold Watch & the sum of two
hundred dollars of me

Said Watch Co. Burton Esq. upon the like limitations, uses, & trusts herein
before mentioned and declared for the use and benefit of my said daughter
Mary Hitt, my Carriage & Horses all my Household & Kitchen Furniture
all my goods and Chattels and all my other property of whatever kind or
description never not herein otherwise specially devised, as also a pair of good
& strong Coach Horses which my son Samuel has promised & agreed to purchase
for me - Then I give and devise unto my Grandson Nicholas Son of Saml
my Mullatto Boy Matt Son of Aug. and now in the possession of his father the
said Saml. Then I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Samuel Song
the following Negroes to wit, Peter, Ambrose, Lemy, Lucy, Clarissa & Waga, with
this proviso and Condition that he accept the legacy in full discharge of all
debts and demands due and owing from me to him at the time - I am content
that he purchase for me in a reasonable time, a pair of good & strong Carriage
Horses - and provided the said Samuel Song will not accept of the said
Legacy - in the terms and Conditions above mentioned - Then my will & devise is
that the Legacy bequeathed to my said son Samuel Song be declared null
and void and of no effect, and that the property bequeathed to him be sold
by my Executors herein after constituted and appointed on twelve months Credit

at the discretion of my said Executors and the proceeds thereof or so much thereof
as may be necessary - applied to the payment of my just debts and to the purchase
of a pair of good and strong Carriage Horses - for the use and benefit of my said
daughter Mary Attk, as aforesaid if she shall so direct - Item I give & bequeath
to my grand daughter Rebecca Jones wife of Cadwall Jones my two Negro Women
Phoebe and Ad Judge with my request that the former may remain on my
said grand daughter's Land in the Occanuck neck in order that said Negro
Woman Phoebe may be near her husband - Item - I give and bequeath unto my
Grand Daughter Mary Long - daughter of Sunfort Long - my Negro Girl Kitty
on Condition that she convey - and deliver the eldest child of the said Kitty then
born Maria Long - and the said Kitty, second child then born Phineas Long
but in case my said grand daughter Mary Long - or her husband shall refuse or omit
to do so - then this Legacy is to be considered null and of no effect - Item I give &
bequeath unto my grand son William Sunfort Long - my Negro Girl Annetta
on Condition that her first child be delivered and conveyed over to my grand daughter
Louisa Long daughter of my deceased son Richard - and in case my grand son
William L. Long - shall refuse or omit to do so, then this legacy to be considered null
and of no effect - Item It is my will and desire and I do so order & direct that
my Negro boy Valet be sold by my Executors and that the money arising from
said sale be equally divided between my two Sons Nicholas Long of Georgia, and

and shall be equally divided between my two sons - Nicholas Seng of Georgia, and
John Joseph Seng of Tennessee - And it is my further will & desire that I do so
order that a lock of my Hair be inclosed in a ring - or such other Case as my Son
in Law Colonel Baptist J. Stib, may direct and presented by my Executors whom in
testimony of my affectionate regard and good wishes for him I hereby I nominate
constitute and appoint my friends Hutchins, G. Burton, William Drew Esqrs & my son
Samuel Seng Executors of this my last Will and testament - And now I
solemnly set my hand and Seal to this paper declaring it my last Will & testament
as well as the accompanying annexed sheet to this paper. Done at Quantico this
day of November in the year of our Lord 1814 -

Codicil to the foregoing Will - Whereas a part of the land lying on Roanoke River
which I inherited from my brother Barnabas & W. Munnie runs across the road leading
from Halifax Town to Bridge Ferry & is included in the lines & bounds of the said
Land devised by my Son M. Munnie Seng to his brother Richard Munnie Seng -
I do give and bequeath that part of my said Land to my Grand Children

Nicholas John Long, Richard Harrison Long and Louisa Long the Surviving Children
 of the said Richard to them and their heirs forever - as Tenants in Common with
 this express proviso and Condition that they accept the same in full of any
 Claim which they or either of them may have after the land devised by my said
 Son Mr. Minnie Long to ^{the Children of} his Brother George Washington Long - provided he should
 have any use if not to the heirs of his father John & Ann that they release to the
 Children of my daughter Mary Galt - now living and particularly named in
 my foregoing Will - all each part or parts of said Land as they may be
 entitled to but in case they said Nicholas John Long, Richard Harrison Long
 and Louisa Long - or either of them shall refuse to do so, then it is my will
 and desire - and I do so order & direct that this Legacy - be declared null & void
 and of no effect - and I do and bequeath all my said land which lies over &
 to the Eastward of said Bridge Ferry - road to my Grandchildren Margaret
 Maria Bassett Galt, Mary Larina Bassett Galt, Mary Mc Minnie Bassett Galt
 William Anderson Galt, Albert Augustus Bassett Galt, Martha Elizabeth Long
 Galt, Nicholas Long Galt, Sarah Frances Washington Galt, Fanny Virginia
 Churchill Galt and Bassett Mary Harison Galt - and to them & their heirs
 forever as Tenants in Common - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and seal at Quantico this day of November 1864 - declaring this present Codicil
