

Will of Busham Bryan

In the name of God Amen I Busham Bryan of Johnston County being I
sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God so that
Twenty fifth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand
Seven hundred & eighty seven made and published this my last Will &
Testament in manner following that is to say:

I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Sarah Bryan the following negroes
to wit: Peter, Rose Abram, Dimer, Cooper, Duke, Betty, Hill and
Phillie eight Miles Cattle, three work horse creatures.

I give to my son Edward Bryan the plantation wherein I now live
Within the following limits: Beginning on the river at the mouth of the Canadi
branch above the plantation where negro Pender lives running up the
maine of the Mirey prong of said branch to where the East fork crosses the
same thence a straight course to the mouth of Powell's branch on which
all the lands that I possess above said lines and courses adjoining
Mountfield and the River to him and his heirs forever

I give to my son Clement Bryan all the lands I possess on Black Creek
(Except your hundred acres known by the name of Cascup place them and
his heirs forever)

I give to my son Benjamin Bryan all the other lands I possess on the
North side Neuse River below the lands given to my son Edward and
your hundred acres known by the name of Cascup place them and
his heirs forever

I give to my daughter Sarah two negro girls named Tidell and
Ruth my large writing desk two silver plates & candlesticks
and if either of the above negro girls die before the year 1790
I desire it to be made up to her out of the other negroes to her and
her heirs forever.

My will and desire is that all of my personal estate be
Kept together until the year one thousand seven hundred
and Ninety and the money arising from such profits of
my stock as may be marketable and from debts due me
to be applied for the education of my children and that they be
left at school until that date 1790. And at that time all
the negroes and all the stocks of all kinds (that is to say
given above to my wife and daughter) to be equally divided
amongst my three Sons and my daughter.

My Household furniture tools and plantation utensils (except
the above mentioned to my daughter) be equally divided amongst
my wife and all my children.

That my executors will sell all such part of my childrens property as may
be wanting and apply the money to the benefit of the child it belongs to
and I do constitute and appoint my widow friends

..... to be my executors to this my lost will and
testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this
20th and day above written

Seeque Suela published and declared by the said Nathaniel Bryan the
Testator of his lost Will and Testament in the presence of us

Johnson County, February Court 1782.

There was the before writing purporting to be Nathaniel Bryan's lost Will &
Testament exhibited in open Court for probation which was by
the Court admitted to probate and ordered to be recorded
