

January Testimony 1857.

James Brotherton will.

I James Brotherton of the County of Lincoln and State of South Carolina, being old and infirm, and not expecting to live long in this life, but of sound and perfect mind, blessed be God, do make this my last Will and Testament in the following style: First, I will that my body shall be buried in a most Christian style. 2^d I will that all my just debts shall be paid out of my effects. 3^r I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Peggy the one half of my plantation on which I now live in value, running the lines embracing an equal portion of wood land, so as not to interfere with my sons houses, Thomas, William & John, I also Will to my wife my negro woman Sally and a negro boy named Jonas and furthermore all my house hold and kitchen furniture and all my Stock of every kind, also my Wagons and Hounds and all my farming tools for her to have and to hold during her natural life or widowhood so as to leave a portion for my sons Hiram and Meua to make them equal to those of my children that have left me.

4^t I Will and bequeath to my four sons William, John, Hiram and Meua all the balance of my negroes at my death and also my negro Sally and her increase and Jonas at my wife's death I will that my four sons viz; William, Hiram, John & Meua pay to the balance of my heirs out of the negroes Viz; to my son Thomas one hundred dollars to my son George five dollars to my daughter

my negroes daily and her increase and goods at my brother's death
I will that my four sons Virg; William, Miriam, John & Anna pay to
the balance of my heirs out of the negroes Virg; to my son Thomas one
hundred dollars to my son George five dollars, to my daughter
Susan fifty dollars, to my daughter Poll. fift. dollars and to my
daughter Martha fift. dollars. I also will to my five sons Thom-
as, William, John, Miriam and Anna all the balance of my land
at my death to be equally divided among them and also an equal
share of the land left to my wife at her death. I leave my wife
Peggy and Son Miriam my only Executors to this my last Will
and Testament. To this my last Will and Testament I have unto
set my hand and seal this 18th day of May 1853.
