of North Carolina Lincoln County do make and  
Ordinal this to be my last will and testament that  
is to say principally and first of all I give and  
recommend my soul into the hands of living God  
God that gave it and may guide to the out side  
from whence it came. And as touching my worldly  
estate I give and dispose of in the following  
manner First of all and my just debts to be  
paid if any there is much less to give and  
bequeath unto Packard my servant believe me to be  
the place wherein we have lived with all the  
appurtenances necessary to live and with real  
and personal that is all the furniture and stock  
of every description the house and all that it  
contains Except there is more than she would  
wish to keep if they may sell what she don't want  
with the advice of the Executor and she is to  
have the interest of what ever will be as much  
as she needs and if any over let it be at interest  
and in case she don't want to live the place about  
may rent the place or as much of it as she thinks  
fit or perhaps may get a copy right if not the regular  
may be sold or hired whatever it may be at least  
and she is to have their hire or the interest of their  
price or as much as she needs as said above  
and the balance to be at interest during her  
life and what ever is sold let it be above probably  
if it can to any advantage if not make a sale  
But if she sees cause to keep the place and  
business going on as usual she may make a trial  
and then do as they think best for we know there  
is many things about a place that is useful  
yet don't bring very little but selling them  
privately and giving time they may sell better  
in case she chooses to keep the farm going  
on if the Executor cannot see to it let him  
on her first son and that will be a

up that if John Bell would choose to come he might  
perhaps do as well as any and if he does well  
let him have a share equal to our son at  
her death as he come so far to see us he  
ought to be considered up to the Books and  
Clothing of every description our son is to  
share among themselves and what of  
the furniture they please to divide they may  
and all that is just to sell their Cousin Anna  
is to share with them and the place at her  
death is to be given unto James but every  
thing else is to be divided as said above  
all the Dishes affairs and her bed and furniture  
and all her clothing is to be left as she please  
Except she was so frail as to unfit her for  
being a judge of who wanted and if so  
then every thing must go as is judged as  
equitable and this must be left to the  
Executor and some others whom he may  
choose if it should be thought fit to sell  
Linen and Cate and Rose well if not  
she may keep them if she does well if not  
she may sell her and buy another or more  
if able which she is to have during life This  
I confirm in Witness whereof I set my
