In the name of God Amen. I William Pickens of the State
 of Carolina & County of Chatham hereby proposing consider-
 able health & of sound mind & memory (blessed be God for his
 mercies) but sensible from my advanced stage of life that
 I am on the confines of the eternal world, do publish this
 my last will & testament in manner & form as follows-
 viz I bequeath my body to the dust to be buried in
 a decent manner in the cemetery of my Executors, and my
 soul to God who gave it trusting & relying on Jesus Christ
 through his precious blood as our only redemption
 whereby I believe that God in his goodness has bestowed
 upon me I bequeath of it as follows- viz
 I bequeath to my son William Pickens one hundred
 acres of Land lying on the north part of my plantation
 joining Henry Park & William's River to him his heirs
 and assigns forever. Item I bequeath in the same man-
 ner my land viz 100 acres to remain in the possession of the
 the entire care of my daughter now single so long as any two
 of them shall continue single & chosen to be a third & if
 in partition or other wise divided I bequeath of Land to be
 exposed to Public Sale. Item I bequeath that my three daugh-
 ters single be appointed equal to those already married
 & Item I bequeath that all my property not included in the above
 bequeathments be sold to pay out of the money
 thus raised together with the above piece of Land divided
 to be sold all just claims & against me. Still be thinking
 of the residue to be given to my son & daughter.
