In the name of God amen. I Daniel Henderson of
Hicklingbury County in the province of North Carolina
being sick & weak in body but of sound mind do
be God for it, and expecting my dissolution to be nigh
to make this and publish this my last will & Testament
which is as follows - first I give & bequeath to my wife
Eliza I give & bequeath unto my dear and beloved wife Elizabeth
Horn and Scadells their bed and bed clothes and all their other bedding
which she may need two cows & hawks and six sheep and one
which named Wolf, and the half place lying between her and
my daughter Margaret and her husband Robert

Also I give and bequeath unto my son James a negro boy
named Tom, I give & bequeath to my son Stephen a negro girl named
Anne, I give & bequeath unto my son Matthew the plantation
I now live on - said plantations & effects to come
out of -

in which he will have a room to
live in to be taken

Land containing 50 acres lying between my son Williams
and Thomas H. Lands and his house in Hillsboro. & his wife
and father died in, his widow and his children and his body
brother and a fellow & Suckling & a negro boy named John
I give & bequeath unto my son Joseph one hundred pounds
to be paid him. And of my estate, including my young black man
and his wedded & gotten. A mulatto girl named Lucy +
Eliza. I give & bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth my
House and her bed settee and her chair & Calico, and a feather
bed and bed clothes and all her body bedding and young
boy or slave named David.
I give and bequeath unto my son Richard one hundred
fifty acres of land joining my other daughter plantation at
the Negro Bay Hundred Bank and the same in case of my
mother and his brother Matthew who is to school him
and brother James said is to have his work and the work of
his wages & keep, is to tell his father at the age of 20, . . .
that his brother Matthew shall give him to House Dwell
by way of reward as so many pounds per year to him till he
has learned & his wages \$200.00 to let him the same. Done.
My will further is that the remainder of my goods I will
sell and my debts collected and before them are bounded paupers
it is ordered to be distributed to my dear family. I do it that my
wife practice get the third part of the remainder and the
other two parts to be equally divided between my son
Matthew, Jessie, Margaret and Magdalene.

I add also and beseech they bear this witness. Alexander
H. Stephen & Glazebrook to be the executors of this my last
will & Testament, wood, candle, candlestick this my will in paper
discreased in the year instant 4, in morning thereof. In witness
whereof I the said Daniel Alexander have hereunto set
my hand and seal the 25th day of March in the year of our
Lord 1776.
