& satisfied — 3^d I will & bequeath to my be-
loved wife Mary — the slaves — during her na-
tural life the tract of land on which G. now lies
containing one hundred & fifty acres to be given
to her to the end known by the testator who
tract also my negro boy Bill & one hundred &
five acres to be given all the household &
kitchen furniture — & her choice of five head
of cattle & two of the best horses & with
grazing for the same one cow and four &
sheep — the head of sheep is however all
the following estate to — 4th I will & be-
queath to my loving wife and at her
disposal my negro girl Jane and all the
books taken with my from you except the children
to be boarded rate School out of the
proceeds of the land at the dissolution of my
wife — 5th I will and bequeath to my loving
daughter Lydia the Sum one hundred dollars
