also - I also will & bequeath my bed & furniture to my
sister Mary Berryhill, also will my chest to Peggy
Berryhill - I also will a small table to my Black I also
will my Corn & fodder, more fustick and beards cows & Hogs
be sold to pay my debts -
I constitute Andrew Black and Samuel Berryhill my Executors
of this my last Will and Testament. In witness where of I have
set my hand and seal this 10th day of October 1783.

of a Neckhock my Wife of North Carolina being of sound mind
but considerably indisposed in body, consider of the nearness
of this life. Do make this my last Will & Testament in
manner & form following VIZ First It is my Will and
desire that my hereafter named Executors pay all my present
debts in such way as may best comport, with the interest of
my sister Rachel Curranth & her Daughter Susan Curranth -
I Give & bequeath to my sister Rachel & her daughter Susan
yet life all the tract of land on which I live containing
about one hundred & forty three acres more or less and all
my stock of Cattle & Hogs my little Sorel mare with
Hutchin & Kitchen furniture with all my farming

Together with all the crop now growing in the tract which is not rented out, with all that which shall be done at the end of the year for rent all of which the my said sister may use as she may think most proper -

3dly It is my will & desire that at the death of my said sister Rachel Iulin, that the Tract of Land hereinafore given her for life be the property of my niece Susan Iulin & I do hereby give the same to her and to her heirs forever - (Provided nevertheless she shall be bound to pay to the heirs of my brother William the son of Tennessee the sum of Two hundred dollars and to pay Mary the wife of George an annuity of one dollar each of 10 Irish Liggers shall be paid in some reasonable time after the death of her said mother Rachel Iulin -

4thly It is my will and desire that whatever part of the personal property hereinafore given to my sister Rachel Iulin for life remain at her death with all its increase if any shall be, and I do hereby give to my niece Susan Iulin to her and to her heirs forever - hereby revoking & annulling all other wills, In Witness whereof I have set my name and seal with my own hand this 25th day of April 1826 -

Having committed to Maria Everett in the proper place I do now hereby appoint my friend Paris Alexander & Stephen Fox Executors to the my last will.
