that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried  
in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my executors  
nothing desiring but at the general resurrection I shall  
receive the same again by the mighty power of God at the  
general resurrection and as I now long much mortality to live  
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life

I give & bequeath the sum in the following manner and  
time - First of all I give & bequeath to Valentine Hiff my late  
son-in-law one Dollar - Second I give & bequeath to my son  
James Allison Hiff in Dollars - 3d I give & bequeath to  
Margaret Hiff Daughter to my son-in-law Andrew Hiff  
all the remainder of my estate Real and personal  
etc do hereby make & declare my son they from & aforesaid  
Mr Leary & Robert Lee except my whole & sole execution of this my  
last will & Testament and do hereby utterly disallow renounce  
and disannul all and every other former testament wills  
executed or made or written and do testify and complain  
this and no other to be my last will & Testament the witness  
whereof I have set my hand thereto this 16<sup>th</sup> day of June 1811  
Signed sealed published pronounced & declared by  
David Allison as his last will & Testament in the  
presence of the above in the presence of each other  
Witnesses hereunto set their names -  
Michael Leary . . . . . David Allison

In the name of God amen I George Allen of Mecklenburg  
County in the Province of North Carolina being weak of  
body heart of perfect mind & memory calling to my mind the  
mortality of my body as it is appointed for all men once to die  
I do therefore make this my last will & Testament  
I do hereby make my body to be decently buried and all funeral ex-  
penses to be paid and all my just debts to be paid  
Also I give & bequeath to Sarah my beloved wife one hundred

with her mare and Saddle with the third of all my  
possessions Estate -

I Will & Bequeath to my Son George the plantation I  
now live on, he paying up to my Daughters the sum of one  
hundred & Twenty pounds between the hours at the age of  
Fifteen or sixteen, but provided the Child my wife is now  
with in a Son, then I leave him the one half of said tract  
of Land they my said Sons pay up my Daughters the sum of  
Sixty pounds when of age said Land to be divided by my  
executors herein after named -

I Will & Bequeath to my Daughters Mary, Jane Sarah &  
Elizabeth and if the Child my wife is now with be a  
Female all the remainder of my Estate to be equally di-  
vided amongst them except Ten pounds and say gold ring  
(marked Rose & Lin) belonging to my Daughter Mary now in  
having possession in her hands -

I Will & Bequeath unto my Brother John Allen one suit  
of Blue Fustian Clother -

I Will & Bequeath to Thomas Welsh my riding Saddle -  
I also order my executors to sell and dispose of my Negro  
woman at the Standard of my personal estate or at his own  
Sale which ever they think best -

Last this 1<sup>st</sup> of April I will make & do appoint & choose Sarah  
Allen my Beloved wife, my Brother John Allen & Henry  
Robin my Esq<sup>r</sup> to be my Executors of this my last will & Testament  
I do nowe discharge Thomas Welsh executors willow  
Testaments heretofore made done or executed by me in  
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 14<sup>th</sup>  
of April 1770 -
