 County of Mecklenburg & State of N. Carolina being in my  
 declining health of body and mind for which I desire to be  
 the witness, yet calling to mind the mortality of my body &  
 knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die  
 do hereby make & declare this my last Will & Testament  
 that is to say principally & first of all. I commend my  
 Soul into the hands of God who gave it, and my body to  
 be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discre-  
 tion of my Executors, and as touching such worldly estate  
 wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give  
 & dispose of the same in the following manner & form Viz  
 I give & bequeath unto Mary Hannah my dearly beloved  
 wife all that double tenancy or Tract of Land on which  
 I now dwell for & during her widowhood and one fourth  
 part of the same during her natural life, I give unto  
 her my said wife Mary two negro male viz Saml & Green  
 and four Scotch Horses her choice, all the Plows and  
 Harrows and all other farming utensils fit for husband-  
 ry also I include herd of horned Cattle her choice  
 of the whole flock and all the Sheep, Hogs, Geese Poultry  
 and all the Kitchen & household furniture that appears  
 necessary to keep the family conveniently together for & during  
 her widowhood, and then to put into my estate to be  
 disposed of as here after directed. I likewise give & bequeath  
 unto my said wife Mary her Bed & furniture her Dress-  
 -ing and Saddle and all the Dressing furniture and one Negro  
 woman named Bel to her and her assigns forever -

Item I give & bequeath unto William L. Thaw my beloved son  
 the sum of six hundred & fifty pounds, five hundred pounds  
 of which I have already paid into the estate of Thomas  
 Polk cleared on his account, I also give & bequeath unto  
 my beloved son William L. Thaw one Negro man named  
Jack in

Do hereby make & declare this my last Will & Testament  
that is to say principally & first of all. I commend my  
Soul into the hands of God who gave it, and my body to  
be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discre-  
tion of my Executors, and as touching such worldly estate  
whereunto it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give  
& dispose of the same in the following manner & form Viz  
I give & bequeath unto Mary Saunders my dearly beloved  
wife all that double Parsonage or Tract of Land on which  
I now dwell for & during her life and one fourth  
part of the same during her natural life, I give unto  
her my said wife Mary two Negroes named Dig & Sam & Grass  
and four Scotch Horses her choice, all the Hens and  
Hensons and all other farming utensils fit for her use  
I give also I include of horns cattle her choice  
of the whole flock and all the Sheep, Hogs, Geese Poultry  
and all the Kitchin & household furniture that appears  
necessary to keep the family decently together for & during  
her widowhood, and then to sink into my estate to be  
disposed of as here after directed, Likewise I give & bequeath  
unto my said wife Mary her Bed & furniture her Dress-  
- and Saddle and all the Dressing furniture and one Negro  
woman named Bel to her and her assigns forever -

Item I give & bequeath unto William Luther under my beloved Son  
the sum of six hundred & fifty pounds, five hundred pounds  
of which I have already paid into the estate of Thomas  
Polk deceased on his account, I also give & bequeath unto  
my beloved Son William Luther one Negro man named  
Jack in Trust to be equally divided among his Children  
as he shall think proper at his decease.

Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved Son James the  
estate unto the sum of one hundred pounds also my  
right, Title & claim to the value of a Negro Girl named  
Ann, now in possession of John Carls and sold by my

James as my agent unto said John Parke the value of which  
said negro I give & bequeath unto my said son James R. the  
said in trust to be divided among his children as he shall  
think proper at his decease -

" It is my will & pleasure that all my lands lying on McAlpin  
Creek in some Tracts nearly adjoining be divided agreeable  
to equality & quantity into two equal divisions by two or more  
men indifferently chosen by my executors -

Item I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son Silas Alexander all  
that division of the land on McAlpin creek as above described  
on which he now dwells to him his Heirs & assigns forever  
I also give & bequeath unto my son Silas Alexander one negro girl  
named Ann in lieu of the property he furnished towards the  
mountain lands -

Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Hogarth Alexander all  
that other division of my lands on McAlpin creek as above  
described and on which he now dwells to him his Heirs and  
assigns forever -

Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Erno Alexander one  
Horse & Saddle one Bed & bedding and the sum of one hundred  
pounds to be paid by my two youngest sons to whom I give  
the land on which I now live -

" It is my will & pleasure that the plantation on which I now dwell  
consisting of two tenements joining each other be divided in to two  
equal divisions paying due regard to equality and quantity  
Houses & Improvements by three or more men chosen by my  
Executors for that purpose -

Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Jack Alexander one of  
the above described divisions of the land on which I now  
live his choice of those divisions when divided as above  
directed to him his Heirs & assigns forever and one Bed and  
Bedding his Horse and Saddle -

Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Edward Alexander all the  
other above described divisions of the land on which I now  
live unto him his Heirs & assigns forever -

to be in four parts nearly adjoining be divided agreeable  
to Equality & Generosity into two equal Divisions by two or more  
men indifferently chosen by my Executors -

Item I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son Silas Alexander all  
that division of the land on which I now dwell as above described  
on which he now dwells to him his Heirs & assigns forever  
I also give & bequeath unto my son Silas Alexander one Negro Girl  
named Ann in lieu of the property he furnished towards the  
Mountain Lands -

Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Hogarth Alexander all  
that other division of my lands on which I now dwell as above  
described and on which he now dwells to him his Heirs and  
assigns forever -

Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Amos Alexander one  
Horse & Saddle one Bed & bedding and the sum of one hundred  
pounds to be paid by my two youngest sons to whom I give  
the land on which I now live -

" It is my will and pleasure that the plantation on which I now dwell  
consisting of two acres joining each other be divided in to two  
equal divisions paying due regard to quality and quantity  
Honors & Improvements by them or mine now chosen by my  
Executors for that purpose -

Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Jacob Alexander one of  
the above described divisions of the land on which I now  
live his choice of those divisions when divided as above  
directed to him his Heirs & assigns forever and one Bed and  
bedding his Horse and Saddle -

Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Olyver Alexander all the  
other above described division of the land on which I now  
live when divided as above directed to him his Heirs and  
assigns forever & also one Bed & bedding his Horse & Saddle

Item It is further my will & pleasure that each of my two above  
said sons Jacob & Olyver pay unto their brother Amos Alexander  
the sum of fifty pounds as soon as conveniently may be

Item I Give & bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Maria Garrison  
 one Chest of Drawers in Trust for her Daughter, Caroline Garrison  
 which Case of Drawers is now in possession of my said daughter  
 Esther Garrison, and it is my will & pleasure that my Negro  
 woman named Jean and her three Children Dick and Frank  
 and Nancy and other children if any there should be of her  
 offspring, be and remain in her possession & custody wholly  
 for her use & behoof for 4 clearing, the space of eight years  
 and then to be divided between herself & her children as  
 she shall think proper if she should live that long; but if  
 she should die before that time, then at her death to be  
 divided among her children as her husband shall think  
 proper —

Item. I Give & bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Virginia Alexander  
 one Negro Girl named Hannah, one feather bed and  
 furniture one bay mare & saddle, one Chest of Drawers  
 six head of horned Cattle & one Silk gown pattern —

Item. I Give & bequeath unto my son James Alexander  
 Elias Alexander, Elizabeth Alexander & James Alexander  
 all my lands lying & being on the waters of Secaucus Creek  
 river consisting of ten tracts to them their heirs and assigns  
 forever upon the following terms Viz that each of them shall  
 do pay unto my Executor or one of Security five pounds & the  
 said lands shall be equally divided among them —  
 And in order to enable my Executors hereafter named to pay all  
 my just debts and the above Legacies it is my will & desire  
 that they sell & dispose of as much of my Estate not devoted  
 as will answer the above Legacies and the residue & remainder  
 of my Estate I Order to be appraised by three indifferent  
 freeholders men of experience & character upon both  
 which said property and Cash (if any) shall be equally  
 among all my children —

And I do hereby constitute & appoint to Mary my wife  
 William Alexander & James Alexander my two eldest

... named Isaac and her three children John and Frank  
and Nancy and other children if any there should be of her  
offspring, be and remain in her possession & custody wholly  
for her use & behoof for & during the space of eighteen years  
and then to be divided between herself & her children and  
she shall think proper if she should live that long; and if  
she should die before that time, then at her death to be  
divided among her children as her husband shall think  
proper —

I Give & bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Maria Alexander  
one Negro Girl named Hannah, one feather Bed and  
furniture one Day mare & saddle, one Chest of drawers  
six head of horned cattle & one silk gown pattern —

I Give & bequeath unto my four Sons James A. Alexander  
Silas Alexander, Joseph Alexander & Amos Alexander  
all my lands lying & being on the waters of French Creek  
near consisting of ten tracts to them their heirs and assigns  
for ever upon the following terms Viz that each of them shall  
do pay into my Executor or some of Security five pounds & the  
said lands shall be equally divided among them —

And in order to enable my Executors hereafter named to pay all  
my just debts and the above Legacies it is my will & desire  
that they sell & dispose of as much of my Estate not devised  
as will conduce to that purpose and the residue & remainder  
of my Estate I Order to be appraised by three indifferent  
freeholders men of experience & character upon both  
the said land property and both (if any) shall in equally  
among all my children —

And I do hereby constitute & appoint Mary my wife  
William Alexander & James A. Alexander my two eldest  
Sons to be my sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament  
and I do hereby disallow revoke & disannul all &  
every other former Will, Testament, Bequest & Grant  
by me or any of them made or bequeathed before, hereby

and confirming this and no other to be my last will & Testament  
In witness whereof I the said Hezekiah Alexander have hereunto  
set my hand & Seal this 8th day of August 1796.

I do hereby certify and confirm the last & Testament of Hezekiah Alexander which he did on the 8th day of August 1796 and is as follows Viz: That the said Hezekiah Alexander divided in said will to my wife Mary is only clearing her widowhood I hereby declare you & your heirs the one half of said stock her, her heirs & assigns, for ever the other half of said stock to be disposed agreeable to the direction of the will - And whereas there is in said will no mention made of Charles Polk or his children, I the said Hezekiah Alexander do now will give & bequeath unto the said Charles Polk all the property which my late beloved daughter Mary took with her after her marriage with him & of Negroes &c &c &c

Also I do hereby impower Virginia my daughter not only to sell so much of my estate not devised as may be sufficient to pay all my just debts & the expenses incurred in said will, but also to sell or appraise agreeable to said Will as they shall think best all such remainders or remainder of my Estate as shall at any time fall into their hands or hereafter sink into my Estate & the net proceeds thereof equally to divide among all my children now living or then appear if dead at the time of said distribution - Lastly I declare that this indeed be annexed to and become a part of my last will & Testament

I do hereby read in full the terms of the last Testament of Henry  
Alexander made dated the 8th day of August 1796 and as  
to Henry Orr - Heirs of the said, Sheriff, Heirs & Executors divided in said will  
to my wife being in only during her widowhood I hereby declare  
I give with the one half of said stock two, two thirds & assigns, for one  
the other half of said stock to be disposed agreeable to the direction  
of the will - And whereas there is in said will no mention made  
of Charles Polk or his Children I the said Henry Alexander do  
now will give & bequeath unto the said Charles Polk all the property  
which my late beloved Daughter Mary took with her after her  
marriage with him viz Negroes &c &c &c

Also I do hereby impower Virginia my executrix not only to sell  
so much of my estate as she may in judgment to pay  
all my just debts & the debts mentioned in said will but  
also to sell or appraise agreeable to said will as they shall  
think best all such remainders or remainders of my estate  
as shall at any time fall into their hands or hereafter sink into  
my estate & the net proceeds thereof equally to divide among all  
my Children now living or then after if dead at the time of  
said distribution - I do hereby declare that this indeed  
be annexed to and become a part of my last will & Testament
