of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to  
die do make & declare this my last will and Testament that is to  
say principally & first of all I give my soul into the hands  
of God & Almighty God that gave it to my body I recommend to  
the Earth to be buried in a decent manner at the direction of  
my executors. And as touching such worldly estate where with  
it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give & dispose of the  
same in the following manner and form viz

I Give & bequeath unto Elizabeth Wilson my dearest beloved wife  
the one third part of all my movable estate and her Maintenance  
in the said during her natural life.

Item I Give & bequeath unto Mary Esborn my beloved daughter the  
sum of Twenty Shillings.

Item I Give & bequeath unto Hannah our my beloved Daughter the  
sum of Twenty Shillings.

Item I give & bequeath to Catharine Wilson my beloved daughter one  
she named Ball the saddle, two beds & bedding two cows & two hds  
& twenty five pounds or the value thereof at the discretion of my exec  
Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved son John Allen all that part of my  
plantation on which I now live situated upon and being a certain  
part of a long stream from the middle East corner thereof near the  
School house through the poplar hollow till it strikes High  
Creek where I find to him his Hds and apparel former and one  
horse and saddle one bed and bedding --

Item I Give & bequeath unto George Allen my beloved son all that  
plantation situated lying & being on the Middle Creek, over to him  
his Hds & apparel former and one horse and saddle --

Item I give & bequeath unto William Simpson Allen my beloved son by  
the remainder of my lands to him his Hds & apparel former &  
as that his Mother shall never in living "the same --

desire do make & declare this my last will and testiment that is to  
say principally & first of all I give my soul into the hands  
of all wise almighty God that gave it to my body I recommend to  
the Earth to be buried in a decent manner at the direction of  
my executors. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith  
I am blessed God to bless me in this life & give to dispose of the  
same in the following maner unto from 162

I Give & bequeath unto George Allen my deare beloved wife  
the one third part of all my moveable estate and her Maintenance  
in the land during her naturall life.

Item I Give & bequeath unto Mary Barber my beloued daughter the  
sum of Twenty shillings.

Item I Give & bequeath unto Hannah Bee my beloued daughter the  
sum of Twenty shillings.

Item I give & bequeath to Catharine Allen my beloued daughter one  
huse named Hall the 1<sup>st</sup> huse two rods & bedeling long boarthe & two rods  
& Twenty four perches or the value thereof at the discretion of my executors  
Item I give & bequeath unto my beloued son John Allen all that part of my  
plantation on which I now live situate lying and being soother  
of a brooke drawne from the aforesaid East branch Hudding near the  
School house through the poplar hollow till it stokes Highe  
et then turnse hard to him his Heire and heires forever and ever  
since undividedly the brooke and bedeling.

Item I Give & bequeath unto George Allen my beloued son all that  
plantation situate lying & being on the Highe side or in soother  
his Heire & heires forever and one Horse and Saddle.

Item I give & bequeath unto William Simplician my beloued son by  
the remainder of my lands to him his Heire & heires forever  
as that his Master shall never inclose of the same.

Item After my debts and plasure that after all my debts & charges  
are paid that all the remainder of my lands be equally  
divided between my four youngest daughters of all drighty  
Allen, & George Allen, & Mrs. and Ellen Barbara Elson,  
and then my wife & son in law if any of them should  
die before me by accident.

it  
divided among his surviving Brothers, and further that if  
any of my, one of youngest Daughters should die unmarried  
that her inheritance should be equally divided between the  
descendants of the last mentioned girls.

And I do hereby constitute and appoint myself John Allen  
of John Allen my son Johnson, born my son in law to be my sole  
executor of this my last Will & Testament and do hereby  
certify, disallow revocation of any will and every other  
former will, Testaments, signature & instrument in any wise  
named referred to be executed before publishing this & no other  
to be my last Will & Testament for Testimony whereof I have  
sett John Allen to bear hereunto set my hand and seal.
