 Elizabeth Alexander & Susan Alexander, and I do require
 the monies arising from the sale of my negroes which I
 allow to be sold be equally divided among the above men-
 tioned Children, Also do bequeath to Josiah my son my
 plantation which I live, but his mother is to have the man-
 in order to maintain the children while she remains a
 married & on her marriage to be given up to Josiah my
 Eldest Son, And of the monies arising it shall be set out
 Joseph at 18 eighteen years of age, and Josiah shall pay
 his youngest Brother Susan 1000 when of age and
 my sister Deborah 1000 and Elizabeth five pounds when
 of age, And I order Josiah to be put to learning of the day
 when of 18 proper age In witness whereunto I have set my hand
 and Seal.
