In the name of God Amen. I William Dickens of the State
of Carolina & County of Chincoteague professing consider-
able wealth of sound mind & memory thank God for his
mercy but sensible from my advanced stage of life that
I am on the confines of the eternal world. Do publish this
my last will & testament in manner & form as follows.

1st Imprimis. I commit my body to the dust to be buried in
a decent manner according to custom of my Execution, And my
soul to God who gave it breathing & relying upon many
thresholds & doors to have been honored & worshipped.

Worldly substance that God in his goodness has bestowed
upon me I dispose of it as follows - 2d

Imprimis. I declare to day I do ~~not~~ ^{do} ~~intend~~ ~~desire~~ to sell or divide
any of land lying on the North part of my plantation

Leaving Henry Farr & William Dyer to him his heirs
and assigns forever. Item I desire in case of my death
my land may be given to remain in the possession of

the entire care of my daughters single so long as any two
of them shall continue single & known to be aforesaid. If
separation of the above mentioned parcel of land to be

expedient after my death I desire that my three daugh-
ters might be apportioned equally to those hereby named.

Item I desire that all my property not heretofore made
over to my wife except what I shall then out of the monies
then gained to her with the above parcel of land devide

to be sold all just demands against me & shall be divided
of the residue to be equal to each other & if not equal to

it will be so rated & so divided among my

William Porter of Charleston in the County of Beaufort, being
in a very weakly state of body, having perfect mind & memory
desires to make his last will & testament that it may
be witnessed by two friends, & to be registered in the office of the
Mortality & knowing that it is appointed for all men once
to die, do make this my last will & testament that it may
principally direct my soul from the hands of my God into
the hand of almighty God with great hope for my body I
recommend it to him to be buried in a decent Christian
manner at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubt-
ing but w^t the general resurrection I shall receive them
again by the mighty power of God, and as I trust my soul
will be safe, whereas it has pleased God to be born
with me this life I give & devise to Christopher in the following
manner. That is to say in the first place I give to
myself in all my just & lawful d^r w^t to be paid, then the
Leased Land I bequeath to my wife Elizabeth & her
children all my working tools of every description and
apparatus, every thing else being given & bequeathed to John
