In the name of God Amen. I, John Hutch of the County of New Hanover, and State of North Carolina, being of sound and perfect mind and memory (blessed be God) do this the 27th day of October, in the year of our Lord 1828, make and publish this my last Will and Testament, in manner following, viz:
 First. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Esther Hutch the plantation whereon I now live, during her life time, and at her death, to my son David Hutch and his heirs forever. I also give to my beloved wife Esther Hutch, my negro man Peter, together, with all my stock of cattle and hogs, and the rest of my property, perishable be the same more or less, (except that which I may hereafter mention in this my last Will and Testament), to her, during her natural life or widowhood, and after death or marriage to be equally divided between all my children, to them and their heirs forever.
 2^d. I give and bequeath to my son John Hutch, my East plantation lying in the County of New Hanover adjoining the lands of Mary H George and Benjn Shepherd, to him and his heirs forever.
 3^d. I give and bequeath to my son David Hutch, all the lands I purchased from Alex B McCulloch, known by the name of Fork fields, to him and his heirs forever.
 4th. I give and bequeath to my son Charles Hutch, all my piney woods lands, which I purchased from John Averitt and M^{rs} M^{rs} Donald, to him and his heirs forever.
 5th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Henrietta Legoin three hundred

dollars in cash which she has already rec^d, to her, and her heirs forever.
6th. I give and bequeath to my daughter, Comfort Hutch, my negro girl Sarah, to her, and her heirs forever.
7th. I give and bequeath to my daughter, Elizabeth George, three hundred dollars, which she has already received, to her and her heirs forever.
and I hereby make and ordain my beloved wife Esther Hutch and my son David Hutch, Executors of this my last will and Testament.
