I Susan Ann Price of the town of Wilmington & State of North Carolina, do make & publish this my last will & testament (viz) I give and devise all of my interest and estate in & to the lot of land whereon I now reside, being in the town of Wilmington, South side of Market Street conveyed by deed from John A Taylor to Catherine & Price deed bearing date 21st January 1845 registered in book B B Page 420. 26th June 1845 to my sister Caroline A Price, to her heirs and assigns forever, with all the appurtenances and hereditaments, whatsoever, And also all my ~~estate~~ interest and estate to a certain Tract of land and appurtenances on the same near Wrightville conveyed by deed from John & Jones to the said Catherine & Price & Caroline deed bearing date 23rd October 1837 registered in book K Page 328 to the said Caroline & Price her heirs & assigns forever.

I give and bequeath to said Caroline A Price all and singular my interest in & to the following negroes (viz) Lucy Phillis, Dying & Sandy & also George Nancy & Dolly to her entire benefit use and behoof.

I give and bequeath to my niece Betsy Minerva Price a negro girl, called Minerva.

To my nephew Joseph Price I give & bequeath a negro man called Ned & also Edward Nancy & child.

I give and bequeath to my nephew James Price the boy called Samuel.

To my brother Wm A Price I give and bequeath the boy called William And hereby appoint my said Brother Executor of this my last will & testament.

All the rest and residue of my estate I give to my sister Caroline A Price residuary legatee according to my last will & testament.

It is my will and desire, that the lot of land now which I now reside & before described as purchased from John A Taylor & also the tract of land on the Town purchased from John & Jones, that is to say my estate and interest therein in the event of the death of my sister Caroline and should she survive me, shall become the property in fee simple of my Brother William A Price, to have and to hold to him his heirs forever.

 mind, but aware of the uncertainty of life, do make
 and publish this my last will and testament, in manner
 and form following

It is my will and desire that my Executor hereinafter
 named, shall as soon as possible after my death, pay
 - all my debts to whomsoever owing, out of such money as
 may come into his hand as part and parcel of my estate,
 such payment however to be made in accordance with the
 direction herein subsequently stated,

I give and bequeath to my brother Thomas C. Miller
 my negro man Fred, to have and to hold the said negro
 unto him his Executors and administrators forever,

I give and bequeath to my brother Augustus Miller
 my Correll horse Din, to have and to hold the said
 horse, unto him his executors and administrators
 forever

All the residue of my estate alike real and
 personal which may remain after the payment of
 the above specific legacies and just debts howsoever
 due, I hereby devise and bequeath to my beloved wife
 Anne C. Miller and to my daughter Mary S. Miller, to
 be equally divided between them, share and share
 alike and to be held by them, their heirs Executors
 administrators and assigns forever,
 And whereas my present indebtedness is considerable,
 And the business of my estate will doubtless require
