I Jeremiah Outland of Northampton County and State of North Carolina, being weak in body yet in sound memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament this 2nd day of 9th Mo. 1824. — 1st I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lodgia Carter all the property which I bought & sent her to her and her heirs and assigns forever. — 2^d I give and bequeath to the heirs of my son Robert Outland, dec'd William Martha John & Edmund & Mary Outland the lands and plantation where they formerly lived to be equally divided between them to them their heirs and assigns forever. — 3^d I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rachel Outland the choice of my beds & furniture, also one blue chest, one small man one pair of mill scales one linning wheel also my stock of cows and all my poultry one cow blos one coffee mill and one butter pot to her her heirs and assigns forever. — 4th I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Edmund Outland the second choice of my beds to him, his heirs and assigns forever. — 5th I give and bequeath to negro Pansilla whom I raised one cow & yearling also one ^{small} blue chest & linning wheel to be her property. — 6th I leave the remainder of my Estate not heretofore given away to be sold. I give one half to my daughter Rachel Outland. Another half to be divided between Lodgia Carter & Robert Outland's heirs. — I name in and appoint William Outland, Executor to this my last will and Testament.
