

Know all men by these presents that I Samuel May of Orange County and State of North Carolina for diverse good causes and considerations me hereunto moving and more particularly the natural love and affection which I have and bear to my said son and daughter and my Daughter Molly and Sally and also for the further consideration of five Shillings specie from each and every of my said children above named to me in hand paid the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and set over and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and set over unto my said son Southern and three Negroes to wit Bob Jack and Kate and also all my right Title Interest and claim which I have or may have in the Negroes who have willed to me or to my wife Elizabeth by Thomas Stephens late of Virginia after the decease of Mary Stephens the Widow and Relict of the said Thomas Stephens dec'd. and also two desks a chest of drawers Table looking glass and chairs which I left with Mary Stephens in Virginia and also all my Stock of Horses Cattle Dogs and Sheep and all my household Furniture plantation tools to him his heirs and assigns forever

To my Daughter Molly May one Negroe Wench called Winifred one Negro Boy called James and half the increase of my Negroe Pegg to her and her heirs and assigns forever

And to my Daughter Sally my said Negroe Pegg and the other half of her increase to her and her heirs and assigns forever

Nevertheless reserving unto myself the use and profits of all the said Negroes Stock and Furniture for and during my natural life and that after my decease it is the true intent and meaning of these presents that my said Children above named shall and may take into their possession to the use and benefit of them and their

Heirs and assigns forever all the said Negroes Stock and Furniture above mentioned agreeable to the aforesaid disposition who bearer of the same may then be remaining In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 24th day of May 1705.

To whom these presents shall come I Athanasius Robison of the County of Orange send greeting. Know ye that I the said Athanasius Robison for and in consideration of the Natural love and affection to my children and their dutifull behaviour to me and for divers other good causes and consideration me hereunto moving hath given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto my beloved grand Daughter Sarah Lindsey one Negro girl named Betty, and the heirs of her body and in case of no heirs the said Negro girl Betty is to be divided between my son Nathaniel Robison and my Daughter Mary Lindsey: and as for the other negroes I am possessed of after my death they are to be divided in the following manner between my son Nathaniel Robison and my Daughter Mary Lindsey and their heirs first Nathaniel is to his three then Mary her heirs so as to they are all divided in case of an odd one that one is to be divided Equally between them do give all the singular right of the negroes unto Sarah Lindsey and the heirs of her body and unto Nath Robison and Mary Lindsey and their heirs forever to have and to hold and Enjoy all and singular the said Negroes unto the said Sarah Lindsey Nathaniel Robison and Mary Lindsey and their heirs Executors administrators and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of them the said Sarah Lindsey Nathaniel Robison and Mary Lindsey their heirs Executors Administrators and assigns forever and I the said Athanasius Robison all and singular the aforesaid Negroes to the said Sarah Lindsey Nathaniel Robison and Mary Lindsey their heirs Executors administrators

and assigns against all persons whatsoever shall and will forever defend by these presents in witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of May 1785.
