 one State of North Carolina being a certain in Years and having under my Commission & Oath
 to uncertainty of Human life, so make the my last Will and Testament in manner and man-
 ner following that is to say in witness whereof I have that my body be decently buried in a Christian
 manner at the discretion of my Executors herein after named and also my
 Worthy Estate which the Lord in Mercy hath been pleased to bestow upon me, I give and
 devise unto my dear and beloved wife Anna Cornor the Dowry as
 which I owe to any manner of Person or Person with my Personal Charges be paid and
 discharge as soon as conveniently may be after my decease by my Executors herein
 after named. Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Anna Cornor the Dowry as
 which I now dwell in, with all the furniture thereunto belonging together with all the
 Land and all the cleared Land that I now hold or may clear during my lifetime
 with timber sufficient to keep the same in good repair to be possessed and enjoyed
 by her during her natural life. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son William
 Cornor a part of the Tract of Land which I now live on being and being in the
 County of Randolph beginning at a Post Oak on the West side the new Town
 of Beaufort, running South twenty chains and twenty five links, crossing the
 Creek to a Black Oak, then West two chains and twenty five links to a
 Hickory, then South ten chains to a Pine, then West three chains to a
 Spanish Oak, then South six chains and fifty links to a pile of Logs, then
 West five chains to a Black Oak, then South five chains and twenty five
 links to a Stone Corner, then West seven chains to a Black Oak, then
 South four chains to a Post Oak, then East four chains and fifty links to a Black
 Oak, then West ten chains to a Post Oak, then North seventeen chains and
 fifty links to a Black Oak, then South on Right line Nineteen
 chains to a Stake in Right line, then East two chains to a Post Oak,
 then North crossing the Creek on his line twenty seven chains to a Pine
 then East twenty two chains to a Post Oak and also the same corner of Pine
 Pine, then West one hundred and eighty links to a bunch of Dogwood, then
 North thirty links to a White Oak, then to the beginning of the tract of
