

together with all stock and moveable property to him & his heirs and lastly I give and bequeath to my Daughter Catherine Larkin my negro woman Rachel and her child Isaac and her bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever and that she is to remain and retain as a home on my lands during the time she may remain single I further will to John Larkin my son 10 Penny to take her and keep her from any county charge and I appoint my wife and John Larkin executors to this my last will the aforesaid distribution of my property is my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all former will or wills by me made in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused my seal to be affixed on the 7th day of March 1818 signed sealed published and acknowledged in presence of us

In the name of God amen I Barnett Moore of the county of Rockingham and State of North Carolina being of perfect mind and memory calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men to die hoping at the resurrection to be raised to life eternal and as relating to such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me I give and dispose of in the following manner to wit all the estate I have ~~left to my eldest sons~~ ^{two} George & William W Moore I give to them & their heirs forever likewise all the estate but to my son Thomas & Moore I now give to him and his heirs with an equal share of the remaining part of my estate not yet disposed with my other children except the land of which he will receive no part I give to my son Thomas I move the soil now by the side of my large small man to be raised free of any expense to him but should it die before it is ready for service he must have another furnished him of equal value all the balance of my estate I give to my beloved wife Anne with her natural life or widowhood and then to be equally divided amongst my children not before mentioned as Betsey L Polly P Richard & Francis B John & I enclose 5 more to them and their heirs forever and lastly I appoint Wm C Moore and Richard F Moore as executor to this my last will and testament signed sealed sealed and acknowledged in the presence of

In the name of God amen I Thomas Mullins
of the County of Buckingham and State of north
Carolina being weak in body but of sound mind and
calling to mind that all flesh must die as a punishment
of such goods as has pleased Almighty God to give
me as followeth

Now it is my desire that my beloved wife live on
my plantation maintaining her maidhood and
if she should marry or go off from me my negro is
to stay on the land and be under the direction of
the executor if he should be unworthy it is my desire
that he should be sold Thomas Mullins if he should
not see cause to buy him that he sold to some
man that he may choose and the money be equally
divided among the four young children I have
Francis Letty and Samuel also that Frank
shall as well for my wife and children that he
should be all owed one day in every week to work
for himself and the profits arising from him
except that one day go to support my

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To my wife a bed and furniture & my maid
bride and saddle I bind to my beloved wife all the
stock horses cattle hogs & sheep and household and
~~bed and~~ furniture and plantation utensils
incurring her staying here or her maidhood also
also my crop on hand is to be for the support of
my wife and four young children be it un-
expected that my boy Peter is to remain here un-
til he is not remembered

Now also it is my wish and desire that all the
property that I have divided unto my beloved
wife surviving such a time be equally un-
divided among my four young children as they
come of age also it is my desire that if young
milly my negro woman should live to have
six children that John and Samuel one a piece
and Francis and Letty have two a piece
and it is my wish that young milly and
her increase after that equally divided among
it then two Francis and Letty and I give to my
wife old milly

Now it is my desire that Peter my negro shall
be sold to some of the Legates if they should see
cause or to some good man or the money aris-
ing from him to be divided as followeth fifty
dollars to my son William Mullins and
fifty dollars to Robert and fifty dollars to
Phoebe Letty and my wife is to pay Thomas
Mullins fifty dollars out of the estate and
the balance of the money and the balance
of the money for Peter is to go to Lucy Letty
for all my land the south side of the
river from the N. E. corner of the
