

18 In the name of God amen. February the  
fourteenth 1785. I Hugh all Gracious of the bounty  
of Rowan and State of North Carolina, former  
calling to mind that it is appointed for all men  
once to die being very weak in body but of  
purged mind and Memory I do make publish  
and pronounce this my last will and Testa-  
ment. First I recommend my soul into the  
hands of God that gave it and my body to  
be buried in a Christian like manner at the  
discretion of my Executors nothing doubt-  
ing but I shall receive the same again at  
the general Resurrection by the Almighty  
Power of God that gave it. And as touch-  
ing such worldly estate wherewith it hath  
pleas'd you to bless me with in this life, I  
give will & bequeath of in the following man-  
ner & form that is to say.  
First I give will & bequeath unto my beloved  
wife Susannah Carey two hundred Acres  
on the east ~~part~~ end of the plantation wherupon  
I now live to have and to hold during her  
life time then to my two daughters Lidia &  
Ann their heirs. Secondly my son John has  
got his portion given him already and is  
to have no more. Thirdly I give will and  
bequeath to my son Boyd two hundred  
York River Acres wherupon he now lives and  
to hold it by this my last will & the deed

made to me by the Carl Granoville 19  
Fourthly I give will and bequeath the remaining part  
of the tract wherupon I now live after the above mentioned  
two hundred is taken of to my son Hughes  
fifthly I give will and bequeath to my daughter  
Elizabeth of that tract of land called the  
poplar springs containing six hundred Acres  
of which she is to have one hundred fifty Acres  
including the Improvements. Sixthly I give  
will and bequeath my daughter Susannah  
Melinda my Grand daughter but my own  
daughter is to have the use of it her life time  
but not to have power to sell or lease it for any  
longer time than her daughter Melinda is of  
the age of Eighteen years. Seventhly I give will  
and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth<sup>in</sup> Hugh  
all what remains of the one hundred and odd  
Acres that but his mother to have the use of it  
her life time but not to have the power to sell  
or lease it for any longer time than her son Hugh  
is of age Twenty one year old. Eighthly  
I give will and bequeath unto my wife all  
my stock of Horses and Cattle and the  
wgon and plantation Tools and a four

20 Negro named Joney Diniak Sarah  
and Frank all which are to be to the use  
of my wife on the plantation to enable her  
to help to pay my debts and to raise the young  
Children and after my wifes death to be  
sold and Equally divided amongst my  
Legates. Finally I give will and bequeath  
to my daughter Margaret that part of  
the six hundred and odd acres tract called  
Delays place so that it be Equally divided  
amongst those that it is left to. And I do  
herby ordain make constitute and appoint  
my two sons John and Boya Executors  
of this my last will and Testament and  
I do herby publish and pronounce this my  
last will and Testament herby Revoaking  
and annulling all former wills and  
testaments by me Made and I do order  
my Executors to sell that Tract of land  
Called Michell Kneys land in the fork of  
the Garden to help to pay the debts  
signed sealed published and pronounced by  
the said Hugh McHenry to be his last  
will and Testament in presence of

the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and  
ninety one. I Felia Motzinger of Rowan County in  
the State of North Carolina Farmer being being  
sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and  
memory thanki be to God therefor calling unto  
the mortality of my body and knowing that it is  
appointed for all men once to die do make and  
ordain this my last will and Testament, that is  
to say, principally & first of all I give & recommend  
my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it  
and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried  
in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of  
my Executors nothing doubting but at the general  
Resurrection I shall receive the same again by  
the mighty power of God. — And touching  
such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased

and form to viz — that is to say first I give and  
bequeath to Elizabeth Motzinger my dearly beloved  
wife to have fifty pounds in hard money in-  
cluding a bond bearing date sometime before our  
marriage as her part of my estate real and  
movable — I then gave & bequeath to my  
son John Motzinger his choice of of all my
