Lastly And I hereby make & ordain my well beloved wife Anna & my son Joseph Cunningham executors of this my last will & test. I witness whereof I the said Joseph Cunningham have to this my last will & test set my hand & seal the day & year above written.

I give & bequeath to my sons John, Willm Thomas & David Cowan on black taffety & a striped silk gown, to be equally divided among them, & it is my will & desire that my son David Cowan shall have all my horses, cattle, sheep, hogs & also all my kids & furniture likewise all my house hold furniture, & every thing except what are named to my other children. I give to him & also my lawfull donee of the land whereon I now live also my said donee of two Negroe fellows named Samuel & John & say him & his heirs forever, & also all the above named children the property which I have named to them & their heirs forever. Lastly I make & ordain my sons John, William & David Cowan joint executors of this my last will & test. In witness whereof I the said Mary Cowan have to this my last will & test set my hand & seal the day & year above written, signed, sealed & published in the presence of us.
