 Imprimis I will that all my just debts which I owe in Right or Conscience be
 well & truly paid by my Excutrix hereafter named within convenient time after
 my Decease. Item I will that all my personal Estate be divided into three
 Equall Parts as near as can be by Persons Lawfully appointed by the Court.
 Two Thirds of which I give & bequeath unto Jacob Pritchard Son of my Wife
 Anne and the Remaining Third to be to & for my s^d Wife Anne. Item I give
 & bequeath unto the s^d Jacob Pritchard and his Heirs for ever all my Lands
 in North Carolina Reserving unto my said Wife Anne the use thereof dur-
 ing the time of her Widowhood. Lastly I do nominate & appoint my said
 Wife Anne Excutrix of this my Will. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto
 put my Hand & Seal this 25th day of November Anno 1718.
