John Toy & Eliza Toy Jacob Toys children.

2. It is my will & desire that all the money that is owing to  
me or in any way coming to me be equally divided between  
the above named children. Also my interest in my  
Brother John Groom's land after it is sold it is my will  
and desire that the proceeds be equally divided between  
the above named children.

It is also my will that my clothes be divided between Lydia  
Toy, Mary Toy, John Toy and Eliza Toy.

I nominate Jacob Toy executor of this my last will  
and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me  
made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand

the benefit of said my negro man and all the household  
and kitchen furniture also provided my personal property  
my just debts I will that she shall have one cow  
& four hogs and the balance not bequeathed to my wife  
to be sold at twelve months credit to pay my just debts  
after my decease.

Secondly I will and bequeath to my Brother Stevens children  
one dollar

Thirdly I will and my sister Elizabeth children living  
& Elizabeth have one dollar of my estate  
Fourthly I will & bequeath to my brother Mathew's children one  
dollar

Fifthly I will and bequeath to my sister Catherine one dollar  
Sixthly I will & bequeath to my brother Francis one dollar  
Seventhly I will my executor collect my just dues and pay my  
debts, also that he see that I am buried in a Christian  
manner at Cavers meeting house also my wife to be buried in  
a Christian manner with common tomb stones to our grave.  
Eighthly I will & bequeath to my friend George Miller children  
all my personal estate after my wife's decease that is Emily  
S. Sarah, Elizabeth, and Titus his son

And I hereby make & ordain my friend George Miller executor  
of this my last will & testament and to execute all parts  
of the same herein mentioned. Testament in witness of the  
said Frederic Stetson have to this my last will & testament  
set my hand & seal this day & year above written signed  
& sealed published and abjured by the said Frederic Stetson  
the testator of his last will and testament in the presence  
of us who were present at the time of signing and sealing  
him.

memory do this 30<sup>th</sup> day of March 1843 ordain publish  
and declare the following to be my last will and  
testament that is to say -  
After all my just debts & funeral expenses are paid  
as hereinbefore directed by my executor, It is my will  
and desire that the remaining part of my Estate both  
real & personal shall remain in the possession of  
my beloved wife Elizabeth Plummer during her  
natural life or widowhood and for her to use &  
have the benefit of the same for the support and  
comfort of herself and my children, so long as they remain  
together, and afterwards except that if any of the children  
should on becoming of age marry or for other cause  
leave her, then it is my will that she should give them  
or any one of them so leaving her such a portion of  
my funeral estate, as she might think desirable,  
for their accommodation or comfort taking an account  
of the same and provide also, that such advancement  
should in no wise impair the balance of my estate  
& do injustice to our other children.

It is my will that after the death of

widowhood of my wife all my estate be equally divided  
among all of my children share & share alike, deducting  
however any advancement which may have been made  
to any of them by their mother as above provided for  
& any such advancement should be made to any one or  
more of them.

Thirdly & lastly It is my will that my executor shall  
have full authority, to sell either at public or private  
sale, according to his discretion, such part of my personal  
property as can be best spared, or taken from my  
family, for the purpose of paying off my debts &  
funeral expenses &c

B. Hampton Executor to this my last will & testament
