I Aaron Albarton of the County of Stokes and State of North Carolina being in perfect mind & memory, blessed be God, do this 18th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty make this my last Will & Testament in the manner following

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Lydia all my household furniture, stock, plantation utensils of every description belonging to me which she well know as there is part belonging to my daughter Elizabeth & Jane on the plantation which I have no claim to nor do not pretend in manner to claim the balance for my wife to hold during her life time excepting those legatee shares which I shall now mention (To wit) I give & bequeath to Charles Christman one dollar and give & bequeath to Rankin Buchanan one dollar and I give and bequeath to Pharoach McKenna one dollar and also I give and bequeath to Tyre Solisby one dollar and my wife may dispose of what property I leave her at her decease as she thinks proper and as to my son Henry Albarton I have made him a deed to all my land which I consider as his distributive share

To prevent any dispute after my decease respecting the property my two daughters Elizabeth & Jane hold I will proceed to mention some of the most valuable articles but perhaps small may left out just belonging to Elizabeth Albarton one bed and furniture on chest & iron chair one looking-glass & some stuff were too tedious to mention one saddle & belonging to Jane Albarton one bed & furniture one saddle and one looking-glass and three head of cattle and some stuff were too tedious I appoint my son Henry Albarton of the County of Stokes Executor of this my last Will and Testament In writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the date & year above written -

I give and bequeath the articles mentioned below to the several persons within named To Rebecca Lumbach my bed bedstead & bedfurniture my glass wheel one dining & one gingham frock, my black cloak and my knife & fork To Polly Lumbach one white frock and one white muslin handkerchief To Mary Lumbach one light colored petticoat To Maria Lumbach one dark colored frock and one white petticoat To Henry Holden children, each one handkerchief To Henry Holden one handkerchief To Mary Holden one handkerchief To Jacob Lumbach & Henry Lumbach each one white muslin handkerchief To Henry Holden Joseph Holden like Holden Rebecca Holden & Mary Holden children of George Holden Junior deceased each one good piece wearing apparel To Rebecca Lumbach daughter of Joseph Lumbach my chest of drawers To Rebecca Spack my great mirror some blue & red plates, each of the sister living in the same room with me one to have a piece of one thing were And I hereby constitute and appoint my brother-in-law Joseph Lumbach Executor of this my last will & Testament

Who is to pay all my debts & funeral Expenses out of my estate & what ever may be left of my estate after satisfying the before mentioned bequestments shall be the property of the said Joseph Lumbach and his wife Elizabeth -

I Peter Allen being weak in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory do make this my last will & Testament as follows. I will will that all my just debts & funeral expenses be paid. All bed clothes & furniture and all the apparel which my deceased wife Margaret brought into me when I married her I give to her only child Mary Allen the dress to be worn for her till she can use them. To my daughter Rebecca I give my spinning wheel & also one bed & furniture if it is not wanted to pay my debts likewise one linen now in her possession as a gift all the rest & residue of my estate both real and personal shall be sold by my Executors or either of them and after my just debts are paid my will is that the value of one cow shall be given & paid to my daughter Mary when she is eighteen years old and likewise a negro slave woman shall be paid to my daughter Rebecca when she is eighteen years old

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Mary after her mother's decease and all what is remaining shall be equally divided among all my children - And I appoint Henry Moser & Peter Moser my sons or either of them Executors of this my last will & Testament & witness whereof I have set my mark with full deliberation this 4th day of February A.D. 1821
