Also - My will and desire is that all the residue of my Estate (if any) shall be sold, and the debts owing to me paid

And if there should be any surplus over and above the payment of my debts and expenses, that such surplus shall be equally divided between my son William B. Harrison and my daughter Laura Ann wife of Thomas K. Poyner, share and share alike to them, and each of them their executors, administrators and assigns absolutely forever

Item - My estate at this present time consists of as follows
I All the stock of Liquors, Groceries, Firlures &c belonging to me, in the building occupied by me, and rented by me of Mess Hornthal & Br. Excepting the following, One large mirror, Eight large pictures, one round black Walnut Table which at this time belong to my son William B. Harrison,

2 - Three Canoes valued at Twenty Five Dollars.

3 - One Sail Boat valued at Seventy five Dollars

4 - Seven Hundred and Six Dollars in currency of the United States now in possession of my son Wm B. Harrison

5 - All my books, notes and accounts and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved children William B. Harrison and Thomas K. Poyner my lawful executors, to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made -
