I Bailey Woodley of the County of Washington and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do makes and declare that my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first that my executors hereinafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts howeverever and to whomsoever owing out of the monies that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate

I give and devise to my beloved wife Deborah Woodley all of my property viz: all my household and kitchen furniture during her natural life time and the said Deborah Woodley is at liberty to sell any part thereof for her maintenance during her natural life and at my wife Deborah Woodley's death. I will and require my said wife to be divided between my three children as follows. To my daughter Charlotte Armstrong wife of Alex Armstrong in the north west end of my plantation commencing in my corner in the north west running south fifty degrees east 40 poles of a white Oak field that I have set myself. I will and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Spear wife of Jacob Spear 40 poles commencing at Charlotte Armstrong's corner south 50 degrees east. I will and bequeath to my son Benjamin Woodley 40 poles lying at the Ann Spear line running south 50 degrees east to my corner in a black gum tree and of this line running south fifty degrees west from this respective corner I will and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Charlotte L. Spear one bed and furniture and one chest said chest containing my wife Deborah brought with her. I will and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Mary A. Armstrong one bed and furniture and one basket said basket my wife Deborah brought with her. The balance of my house hold and kitchen furniture stock and farming utensils to be divided equally between my three children Benjamin Woodley, Ann Spear & Charlotte L. Armstrong. I do hereby constitute and appoint Alex Armstrong my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and every clause thereof hereby revoking and deleting every valid all other wills and testaments by me hitherto made.
