I wrote a book called Georgia Pioneers and their times, which had a paragraph on Barnetts. This is currently out of print, and I don't plan to reprint it. However, I plan to put the info. in that old book in a new database, called "Georgia Genealogies", which should be ready in about 6 months. >>> their 1st child, a female, born 1828, in GA. Their 2nd child M. Barnett,

>>> 1830, GA, and #3 Wesley Barnett, son, born 1836 in Al. She also states

>>> John died before 1850. Bill

> I shared additional info with this cousin about our common ancestor, John
> BARNETT, b. 8 Apr 1794 prob Pendleton Dist SC, m. 23 Jul 1812 Pendleton Dist
> SC to Mary Jane STEELE b. 22 Sep 1790. Mary Jane was the youngest child of
> Isaac STEELE, Rev Soldier who d. 1803 Pendleton Dist SC, and his wife Martha
> Grizzel DIXON. I am fairly certain that John was the son of Amos and Hannah
> (EVANS) BARNETT and that Amos was the son of the John BARNETT who appears on
> the 1790 Pendleton Dist SC census and was a neighbor of Isaac STEELE on
> Generostee Creek. John (b. 1794) died 13 Jan 1847 Benton Co AL. Mary Jane died
> 26 Sep 1872 Cleburne Co AL. Both are probably buried in unmarked graves in

> what is known as the Barnett Cemetery near Muscadine AL. They were the parents
> of 12 children: Amos b. 9 Jul 1813; Isaac b. 8 May 1814; Margaret b. 5 Nov
> 1816; Elizabeth b. 4 Nov 1817 (my ancestor who was the 2nd wife of William
> SIZEMORE, SIZEMORE being my mother's maiden name); Jonathan b. 8 May 1819;
> Jane b. 10 May 1821; John b. Nov 1822; Riley b. 27 Jun 1824; James b. 26 Jul
> 1826; Grizzel b. 1 Dec 1827; William b. 25 Dec 1829; and Wesley b. 7 Feb 1837.
> There may have been other children who died in infancy. And I certainly have
> further information on most all of these children should you be interested.
> My reason for writing you is twofold. First, I would like to know if would
> be possible for me to obtain a copy of the above mentioned book or perhaps
> just a copy of the information on John. Secondly, do you connect to this line
> or have you searched it for someone else? I lost John from about the time of
> his marriage in 1812 until he and his two oldest sons appear on the 1840
> Benton Co AL census. I'm certain that part of this time they were in GA but
> I'm not sure where. He is not the John BARNETT who appears on the 1830 DeKalb
> Co GA census and I don't think he is the John who appears on the 1830 Gwinnett
> Co GA census. Too much of that information does not match though there are
> other family connections to both counties.
> Any suggestions or help that you can offer would be most appreciated.
