The ordinary a^d from the hand of Seth Bellem by Mr C Munnell 7 grants of Land - no letter to explain, Mr Munnell said that Mr Bellem requested him to hand the title to the Ord^y & said that he would not attend on 25th inst according to the summons

Mr A J Harder attended & the Plat^s and Grants were shown to him, he could not explain or point out the Homestead or any of them.

The Sheriff having returned J C White, John Bellem & John Long non est, & the Ord^y having to advertise for 12 weeks, the case is continued to 18 Dec^r 1848
