

I Robert Campbell Sen. of Marlborough District and State of South Carolina being in a bad State of health though of Sound and disposing mind after thanking God my most merciful Creator for his kind mercies throughout the long Period which I have enjoyed of Mortal Existence implore his and our Council by the secret influence over my mind so dispose of the property and possession that have been bestowed on me throughout his bounty in such form and manner amongst my relatives and offspring as may best contribute to enable them by his blessing to live in harmony and Concord with each other throughout this Life and give them a lively hope of forgiveness and his Merciful disposal of them in his Eternal Kingdom-----

In Primis I Give and Bequeath to my Wife Henrietta Campbell and her daughter by me Anne Campbell the Bond due to me from Robert F. ~~Waters~~ of Georgetown District for thirteen thousand dollars with all and every the Interest and advantages arising and accruing on the Same to be owned and held by them jointly or severally each an equal half of the Bond and emoluments as may best suit their inclinations or Convenience I also Give to my said Wife a Negro Woman named Sara and her daughter Rachel and Privilege during life if she ^{so} chooses to live in or Occupy any of my Buildings and to change as may Suit her for Winter or Summer residence if she so chooses as the family does at present to occupy alternately either of my dwellings and to have and enjoy the use of one half the furniture in either or both buildings

and the privilege of two hundred Acres of Land adjoining the home or homes so occupied and in particular I give to her forever my pure chared Side Board with her choice of two beds and furniture in consideration of what my said

on account of a Marriage Settlement entered into with her previous to our marriage it is farther understood and intended by me in the occupancy of the buildings before mentioned that the same privilege to her shou'd extend to the out Houses and Gardens.

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna Campbell by my said wife Henriatta exclusive of her portion of Wither's Bond before mentioned four negroes (Viz) a negro woman named Mindas and her two children and also a negro girl names Lilly. I also give my said Daughter Anne my purchased Secretary which I brought up from Waterloo and also a feather bed and furniture to be selected by her mother. Also I give to my wife aforesaid jointly with her daughter Anne my carriage and two carriage horses with the negro fellow Andrew the carriage driver, my begro fellow Charles and his wife Lissa my present cook to hold as their Joint or seperate property as they may think best.

Item. I give to my most esteemed friend Donald McDearmid in trust and for the use of my son Robert Campbell my Wife Anne Campbell five negroes (Viz) old Price and his wife Betty their son in law commonly called

Jack Kent with his two sons Billy and Tetus which saide negroes if Mr. McDearmid so pleases may live with and serve my said sons mother Wife Anne Campbell or any portion of them negroes that M. McDearmid may think proper may be employed that way or any other that my friend M. McDearmid deems most for the advantage of my said Son or comfort of his mother but no property or owndership of ^{said} negroes is vested in my son untill after he arrives at the age of twenty one and should he die before that time the said negroes are to return to my Estate and be the property and be equally divided between my two sons James & John and my two daughters

Lucia and Anne, or their heirs I also give to my before mentioned friend Mr. McDermid in trust and for the use of my said son Robert Campbell the sum of two thousand dollars to be paid out of a Bond due to me by David R. Williams or out of monies which I may have by me at the time of my decease or if none such to that amount out of the first monies that can or may be collected from the Bonds or notes or accounts that may be then due, Otherwise the amount of two thousand dollars that may be made up for that purpose out of sales of such property of my Estate as I may leave, which two thousand dollars I recommend to my friend M. McDermid to apply to the giving of my said son a good English Education, and if he thinks proper a short term of Lattin merely

Sufficient to know the English words that are in part compounded with the Lattin but not to devote so much time to the Lattin as to prevent at an early age his getting a good English Education and especially Several the most necessary branches of Mathematicks and more especially Still Mensuration and Geography leave it entirely discretional with M. McDermid to act in all respects by my said son as he thinks proper and either if he thinks it advisable to bring him up after his education as a carpenter or some good mechanical trade or put him in a store to learn Merchandise, for which and every other purpose he may deem most beneficial he will employ the labour of the before mentioned negroes and the two thousand dollars, neither of which is to become the property of my said son untill his arrival at the age of twenty one years, and if he should die before that period, the negroes and money or whatever part of them are remaining to revert to my Estate for the benefir of my heirs before mentioned. Should M. McDermid think proper to Send my son to learn a Mechanical trade I should wish the negro boy Titus to be put to learn the same trade. I also give my son Robert

Campbell and his mother Wife Anne Campbell the priviledge if they should be so disposed to live on any part of my land on the three creeks lately purchase by me from Thomas A. Corgil and either to occupy such bildings as already there on or build anew.-----

in doing of which should they be disposed I hope my sons Robert, James & John will aide and afaist them. I also give to them two hundred acres which may adjoin them buildings but not so as to interferem obstructp or be of prejudice to the water course of Robert's Mills. The Whole of property vested Mr. McDearmid for the use of my son and his mother as mentioned before I hope my good friend will act therein according to his will and pleasure and to the best of his judgment, and it is my earnest request that as my son values the memory of his father to be obedient and submifsive and conduct himself according to the counoil Donald and advise of my good friend Mr. McDearmid who I declare is hereby vested with full power at his discretion to apply the property before mentioned in such manner as he may deem proper according to the stipulation before made.-----

Item. I give and bequeath to my youngest son John Campbell all the plantation or tracts of land which I purchased at Sheriffs Sale formerly belonging to the Estate of William Evans being in Darlington District and to contain more or less and lying between what is commonly called my upper plantation and that called the middle plantation also all that other tract of pine land nearly to the tract before mentioned in Marlborough District bought by me at Sheriffs Sale formerly belonging to Maj. James Pouncey and said to contain more or less fronting upon Pee Dee River it being the tract whereon there is a field called field which said two tracts of land I give to my son John exclusive and independent of his dividend of the resudary part of my

proper hereafter to be mentioned.

Item. I give to my two daughters Lucia and Maria Campbell each fifteen hundred dollars in money to be paid out of my Estate, exclusive and independent of their respective and equal dividend of the residuary part of my Estate hereafter to be mentioned.

All the other Estate and property of which I may die possessed I desire to be equally divided between my children by my wife Lucia Campbell share and share alike, exclusive of the property given my younger son John and my two daughters Lucia and Maria in the former part of this will, they are to share equally of the residuary part of my Estate with the other heirs and if my son Robert chooses to take an equal share of the residuary part of my Estate it shall be optional with him either to participate in such share or if he prefers keeping such property as have been already advanced him the value of which will appear upon Bonds notes & accounts on my Books against him, in case of his preferring to take an equal share of the residuary part of my Estate as mentioned, such sums as are due by him for advances already made must be deductive from his share, as also a reasonable valuation of the negro Scipio and Terah already given him for which no Bond or other Satisfaction have been rendered Such Sums as may appear on Bond note or book account that have been advanced by my son James to be accounted for by James to the other heirs in the same manner. My bad state of health induces me at present to make this disposition of my property as my complaint is of such a nature as may terminate my existence

on a very short warning, but should I think proper to annex anything further by way of codicil, or make any alterations in respect of any devise already it is my desire that they

shall be conformed with and held of. disputable validity and by the same virtue and force and if necessary of permanent force and validity to any part heretofore mentioned as they were only annexed after mutual deliberation and reflection. It is further understood and it is my will and desire that the privilege heretofore given in this instrument or will of occupying any of my houses as mentioned before is only intended to be during the time she may continue my wife or remain unmarried and that the two hundred acres of land before mentioned as adjoining said house or houses is to contain or be entitled to no more front upon the river, than the front belonging to the tract in which my present Dwelling house stands, it is further my will that my wife should or shall make her election either to reside or not to reside at the houses mentioned before in six months at most after my decease, after which time should she decline making her election and giving notice thereof the houses and lands as privileges mentioned before shall revert to and be included as part of the residue of my Estate and divided in the same manner and amongst the same heirs as the other residuary part of my Estate. I acknowledge the contents of the foregoing seven pages to be my Will and Testament each page signed by my hand and Seal and my will continued

Also I give to my daughter Lucia to be paid out of the monies left by me at the time of my death & then on hand fifty dollars to purchase a watch chain exclusive of what I left her in my will. To my daughter Maria I also give one hundred and fifty dollars for the purpose of purchasing a watch and chain exclusive of what is left her in my will. It is also my desire that if my son Robert prefers taking his dividend of the Estate as mentioned

at an interest of four percent upon such advances. This codicil I enjoin on my executors to fulfill in every respect as my will. Signed and sealed by me this second day of November in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and nineteen.
