First, I give my soul to God from whence it came.

2nd. I desire my Executrix and Executor to pay all my just debts together with all my funeral expenses out of the first moneys that may come into their hands after my death.

3rd. I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Ann Perry and my dutiful son James Ansel Perry at my death all my real and personal estate, money, choses in action, and everything which I have to them for their use comfort and support of my wife and son during their natural lives.

4th. I do nominate constitute and appoint my loving wife Mary Ann Perry and James Ansel Perry Executor & Executrix to this my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this the 23rd day of April A. D. 1863.
