ing the mortal Condition of human nature that all men are
appointed once to Die, and that is necessary to be prepared for
that Event, I do therfore (Recommending my soul to God through
the mercies of the Redeemer) make the following arrangements
and Distribution of my temporal Estate as follows-----

First I Give Unto my son Ebenezer my large bible and my Watch
and that 100 acres of land where he now lives, likewise 100
acres of land at the upper landing in full for his part-----

Secondly, I also leave unto his Daughter Frances Gibson 60 $\frac{1}{2}$
of the money now endue me by Joseph Witherapoon to be put on
Interest by my Executors until amounts to the price of a young
negroe Wench for her---And likewise if my son Eben^r should have
a son born to him I leave said son 150 acres of land Joining to
W. McElroys land, if not, said land to be sold and Divided among
my Grand Children---Thirdly I leave unto James Gowdy two Cows
and Calves in full for his part And likewise I leave unto my
Grand Children Mary Gowdy Jaⁿ Malcomson Gowdy a negroe boy named
Marcoury the profits arising from said negroe to Equally Divided
between them untill one of them marries or Comes of age then to
be Valued and to purchase from the other or otherwise to be sold
and Equally Divided, and likewise I leave unto said Jas Malcom-
son Gowdy 150 acres of land next to Wm McElroys----- --

Fourthly, I leave unto my son in law William McConnel five pound
in full for his part--Likewise I leave unto my Daughter Frances
McConnel three Negroes named sam hannah and Polly During her life
and at her Dissease to Return to her Issue--the said wench
hannaht to have Every saturday free for herself--likewise I leave
unto the said Ebenezer Franklin McConnel 100 acres of land where
I now live and 200 acres of land Joining it---also I leave to
William Gibson McConnel 200 acres Joining my lower tract only my
Daughter Frances to have the benifit of said land While she

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lives, And likewise I allow my stock of Cattle and horses to be
sold by my Executors and the money to be put out at Interest

for the benefit of my Daughter Frances Children, and likewise the remaining part of the money that will be Due from said Joseph Witherspoon after ^{pay}ing the said 60 %/ I allow to be put on Interest with the other for the benefit of said Daughter Frances Children only I allow 10 % of it to purchase a Riding Chair for my Daughter Frances McConnel When Ever she calls for it, and 10 % I leave to Jas Malcomson Cowdy out of it and 20 % to Mary Cowdy----- And lastly, I do hereby anominate and appoint John Watsen James Tisdale and Wm McConlough sen^r as Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby Revoking all Former Will or Wills made by me and Declare this to be my last will and Testament this first Day of August in the year of our lord one thousand Eight hundred and six and in the thirtifirst year of American Independence-----
