 Dyer one dollar. 7th I will to my daughter Polly Dyer fifty dollars
 to be paid in good trade when she needs it. 8th I will to my daughter
 Fanny Dyer fifty dollars in good trade when she needs it.
 9th I will to my daughter Abigail Dyer fifty dollars in good trade
 when she needs it. 10th I will and bequeath to my son William Dyer
 the plantation whereto now live at the death of my wife with all
 the stock and farming utensils after paying the different bills the

I James Levesque of the State of Tennessee and County of Blount do hereby ordain and appoint this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other and previous wills by me made &c. It is my will that my funeral expenses shall immediately and quietly be paid &c. It is my will that all my just debt &c. being discription be faithfully satisfied.

3^d It is my will that my beloved wife Mary nee Sumner shall have free use of the dwelling house the kitchen and that house during her life time, Also that she shall have two beds with their furniture the household and kitchen furniture, and to have the disposal of them, as she may think best at her death. Also she is to have one dove gown and red Brides and her coffin which she is to dispose of as she pleases at her death and she is further to have her fourth of all that is made on the land I now possess for her subsist.

4th It is my will that the tract of land I now live on shall be divided as follows; Reserving one of White Oak on the south and bank of the Great River straight to a black Walnut, thence to a black Walnut, thence to a hickory Sapling on the bank of the Great River thence to a white Walnut on the opposite bank of the Great River thence to an Oak on the bank of a branch, thence with the branch to an Oak in the bend of the branch; thence to a Sugar tree in the mouth of a hollow River up the stream to it thence to the old log; It is my will that my son Adam shall have the first of the former now live on laying southwesterly of the above described line, Also one red log and one soft corner of red land, lying south west of the old Survey and soft do there is now.
