Dafford my Executors in witness whereof I do this my last will and testament Set my hand and seal this 13th day of February A.D. 1854.

State of Tennessee Belmont County April 2^d 1841 I Michel Goodlink of the County and State aforesaid being in declining state of health and weak in body but of sound mind and discerning judgment do make my last will and testament as follows 1st after the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses out of my estate - 2^d I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel one hundred acres of land in the north end of my plantation including all his land crops and apart by the Spring Branch the house and a small Spring joining to Joseph Dobson in Grant in Grant and Samuel take into two Cane and Kufing his brother James and wife provide for and support him during his natural life 3^d I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Samuel the better part of the full acre of my land to be done off to him by the consent and agreement of the Gods and should he choose to dispose by marriage to enjoy the proceeds of said land and not to see said land except with the consent or to the four Girls sister and now little to be made with her twenty one years old and also to her at Sadler and Bowles and the Grayson he claims Promote the willance that will be answered for he paid by him according to the contract by his own moneys 4th I give and bequeath unto my four daughters namely Mary, Margaret, Elizabeth, Equally and jointly the balance of my plantation to be a joint home for them including all my buildings and all and equal privilege with my son Samuel in the main and Spring and also my four daughters some moneys to her all my personal property and effects and household furniture as the themselves shall decide and agree on. Tulloch son of my son John Tulloch best my saddle and bridle and two dollars in money - 13th I bequeath unto Magnus A. Tulloch son of my son John Tulloch best two dollars in money - 14th I bequeath unto my two Grand sons of my son John Tulloch best my wearing clothes
