trust my last will and Testament to act under the direction
of James Jones and Hugh Mackay whom I appointed
trustees to my estate. Distinct witnesses chosen I have set

year of our Lord 1811 make and publish this my last will

I allow all my lawful and just debts to be paid; I will
and bequeath to my wife Sarah the bay horse and saddle
the mare, and her living of the lower end of the place
while she lives and her bed and clothes and the third
of the sheep; I will and bequeath fifty dollars to my daughter
Cassie and a calf of Pepp's Man and the tubest and
the big kettle and the loom and her bed and clothes
and wearing belts and her saddle two cows and calves
and two third of the sheep; I will and bequeath
unto Mary the small Cornetts and balls contribution
I will and bequeath unto my daughter Elis about two books
Dodridge and Brothers Regal of Palace - Fair and
bequeath unto my son James two Books Benett's Union
on the continent; I will and bequeath unto my
son William ten Books Latham on Temptation and
the life of George Carver; I will and bequeath unto
my daughter Margaret the small Mair and saddle
her bed and her clothes and two cows and two
calves and the third of the sheep and the remain-
der of the household furniture divided equally between
the old woman and David and Mary and the
two dollars to Margaret and John and Margaret
John living their living of the place while
I will and bequeath unto my loving son John a
mound and fifty acres of land running a straight
line across the upper end of the place abate at
both ends and the half of the farming tools
a black man and saddle and a gun of iron

and bequeath unto my son Conrad the lower end of the place
and the pump horse and his saddle and the wagon is to be between
John and Conrad while living to George and if John should die the
plantation the wagon horses and saddle, a two year old heifer
to John and a sparkling horse to Conrad and Conrad is to
give a bushel of a half of Pepp's and yearly and two acres
of Cotton ground yearly, and the money that is left after all
lawful debts are paid goes to the interest of the land and
last is to have his living of the lower end of the place
and I hereby make and ordain my friends James McKim and
William Gault Executors of this my last will and Testam-
ent in witness whereof the said William Means have
to this my last will and Testament set my hand and
seal the day and year above written

sum together with the balance arising from the sale of the
other property is to be divided equally between the four other
legates not heretofore named. My Polly Rebecca Sarah and
Thomas, my sons John and Anne to discharge their re-
sponsibility if she remains my widow. If she marries she draws
a child's part, and leaves the management of the Estate to
the Executors, and I shall consider my widow bound to
give the children proper education the boys to be taught
reading writing and bookkeeping as far as surviving and
book keeping, and I do hereby constitute my worthy friends
William Durham and William Griffith to be my heirs and
sole Executors in witness whereof I have set my hand
and affixed my seal this 1st day of November 1874

equally divided between them, namely, Matthew and
Peterson James and Thomas, and all the personal
property I wish my wife Mary to draw one third, during
and the rest of the property I wish to be equally divi-
ded among all my children, the four boys and three
girls, namely Sarah Mary, Polly, W.B. I wish it is
understood that if Mary dies young she is to have
as above stated and if she should marry I wish
my sons to have the land and the other property
divided as above. Likewise I constitute myself and
ordain Mary Cartwright, William James and Henry

In the name of God Amen I Jeremiah Hammon Tree
of Polk County State of Tennessee being in a last
state of body but in perfect sense and memory calling
to mind the uncertainty of life and the certainty of
death do make and acknowledge this my last will
and testament in form following. First my will
is that all my just debts be paid. Secondly I
leave to the care of my beloved wife Sarah Ham-
mon Tree and my executors hereafter named during
my wife's widowhood, all my temporal estate and
personal property. Thirdly I should my wife Mary again
after my decease my will is that all my estate
be sold and equally divided between her and my
children. Fourthly my will is that my executors
