 iver this to be my last will and testament in the form and words fol-
 lowing to it. First I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary one
 Negro woman named Ester during their lifetime and at the death of
 her wife Mary I allow the said Negro woman Ester to remain in my daughter
 Polly's life and to be her work and service. I give and bequeath to
 my daughter Polly Alexander one dollar. I give and bequeath to my daugh-
 ter Sallie Erwin one dollar. I give and bequeath to my daughter Sam-
 uel one dollar. I give and bequeath to my daughter Peggy one dollar.
 I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary McComb one dollar.
 I give to my son Joseph Michael McReynolds one dollar.
 I give and bequeath to my son Daniel Woods McReynolds one dollar.
 And further I give unto my wife Mary together with me (for my share) Negro
 woman Ester to remain the support of the plantation I now live on
 during her life. I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly McRey-
 nolds two cows and all my household furniture except one bed and
 quilt and sheet at her death. I give and bequeath to my son John
 Dixon McReynolds the plantation I now live on and one bed and
 quilt and sheet and all the stock except two cows
 and forty or so nearby Constitution and I appoint my son Joseph
 Michael McReynolds and Daniel Woods McReynolds Executors of this
 my last will and testament hereby revoking all other former wills or
 testaments by me hereto for made. I a witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and Seal this twenty fifth day of July in the year
 of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty five. By and sealed and delivered
 to be the last will and testament of the above named Joseph McReynolds

 I James McTear of the State of Tennessee and County of Blount
 do hereby make my last will and testament in manner and form fol-
 lowing that is. It is my will that all my just debts be paid.
 Item 1st It is my will that my wife Martha McTear shall have a
 comfortable living of the plantation I now live on also the use
 of the house I now live in. I also allow her a lot of Sixteen ac-
 res which my brother Robert McTear owes me to be paid to the use
 of her during her life. I also allow a two barrels and three pence
 together with the thirteen centavals between all the live stock be-
 longing to me which I wish to go to the use of the family.
 2^d It is my will that my son Robert McTear be paid fifty dollars

in good bread at trade notes. 3rd It is my will that my daughter Elizabeth
 shall have one bed and all the clothing belonging to it and her saddle and a horse
 equal to eighty dollars in trade notes. It is my will that my daughter Nancy
 have a good saddle when she comes to the age of eighteen years also one bed
 and furniture and one horse worth Eighty Dollars in good trade notes which horse
 she is to receive at the age of twenty. 5th It is my will that the plantation
 I now live on shall remain an undivided tract until the death of my wife and
 then that my son James have a choice of buying Montgomery the one half worth
 of the land at that time and keep it if he chooses to do so. If not my son to
 pay him the one half worth of the land and keep it or if they so choose to do
 they remain in it each enjoy my equal rights also my two sons Monty and
 Henry to stand equally bound to my son Robert for his fifty dollars to be paid
 in two years also to my daughter Betty for her horse to be paid in two years.
 Also to my daughter Nancy for the articles specified to her. It is my will that
 the fifty four dollar note in Mrs and Perry be collected and put to the use
 of paying the instalments on the land and that the trade notes I own in
 Mrs Hill go in the payment of a debt to King. It is also my will that
 Henry do get my saddle pig boat and boat. And lastly I do hereby
 constitute and appoint my friends William McTear and John B. McTear
 Executors of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and Seal this twenty fifth of July Eight hundred and
 twenty five Signed sealed published and delivered to be the last will and
 testament of the above named James McTear in the presence of us who
 at his request and in his presence have hereunto Subscribed
 our names as witnesses to the same

I Robert McTear Esq. of the State of Tennessee and County of Blount

 chase and also my pig chest and also one half of my stock of
 cattle. 2^d I bequeath to my son James McTear one fourth part of
 the above mentioned land warrant. 3^d I bequeath to my son Rob-
 ert McTear one fourth part of the above said land warrant.
 4th I bequeath to my son Martin McTear a part of the plantation I now
 live on including the mill and the tools belonging to the mill.
 The line to run from where my son Robert's line crosses the Great
 road along said road to a marked black oak in the hollow on
 the East Side of the creek thence a direct line to Robert Morris
 Line so as to include two hundred acres and also my stock of
 hogs. 5th I bequeath to my daughter Janet McTear one fourth of
 my land warrant laid in the Chickasaw purchase and one
 half of my stock of cattle. 6th I bequeath to my son William
 McTear two hundred and thirty one acres of the plantation I
 now live on including the old improvement and also my
 stock of sheep. 7th I bequeath to my Grand daughter Agnes
 McTear daughter of my son Robert the bed she formerly lay
 on when living with me the bed sheet and quilted or quilt
 one shirt one Blanket and pillow and one pair of shoes.
 8th I constitute and appoint my two sons Martin McTear and

William McTier to be Executors of this my last will and testament allowing them to collect my debts and at my death to equally divide the money in my possession amongst my heirs and when my debts is collected to be equally divided amongst them also allowing my Executors first to pay themselves out of the money for their trouble of collecting and also to equally divide my house hold and kitchen furniture amongst my heirs

McTier the farm whereon I now live to be and remain his and his heirs forever And if my executors think my estate will admit of it that my said son get a classical education 3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah H. Chapman the sum of eighty dollars to be paid in a house or other property valued by my executors and at their discretion 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna B. Johnson the sum of eighty dollars to be paid in a house or other property valued by my executors 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly McTier all my household and kitchen furniture except one bed and furniture to be given to my Son William B. McTier 6th And at the death or marriage of my beloved wife the remainder of my property to be sold by my executors and the proceeds thereof to be equally divided between my daughter Polly and my Son William 7th I nominate and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth McTier Alexander Humphreys and John B. McTier to be my executors of this my last will and testament to which I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of July 1845

Executor I desire to give and bequeath to my wife Mary McTier all of the tract of land I now live on that lies east of the creek upon which my first wife is situated on with the Mill and Banks in the west side of the mill-dam also the one half of a tract of land of one hundred acres adjoining the lands of Robert McTier Dr. Adam Francis and others also one Negro Girl by the name of Polly also all of my perishable property except one Tray three eight & nine years old and my household and kitchen furniture together with all of my money and all debts which is owing & may become due me it is my will that she my wife Mary McTier shall have the sole Control and management of the same as her own right and property during her natural life and at her death I wish the wife to her of disposing of the same as she sees proper do I hereby give and bequeath to my friends Moses Cooper and Miles Cooper that part of my tract of land where they now live that is to say all that lies on the west side of the mill creek also the one half of a tract of land of one hundred acres adjoining the lands of Robert McTier Dr. Adam Francis and others as described before it is my will that my two friends Moses Cooper and Miles Cooper have equal rights to the lands bequeathed and at liberty to dispose of the same as seems to suit them it is also my will that my friend Moses Cooper shall have my Rifle Gun I hereby give and bequeath to my niece Minerva McTier my Tray three eight & nine years old and also one fine dog Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Hugh Bogie and Wm Bogie my executors In witness whereof I do this my will set my hand and seal Charles McTier

Montgomery Thomas In the name of God Amen I Thomas Montgomery of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory sensible of the mortality of the body do make and ordain this my last will and testament I desire to resign my soul to God who gave it and my body to be decently buried The property which I now possess or have bestowed on after my just debts are paid and expense of my funeral I dispose in the following manner first I give and bequeath to my Son John T. Montgomery one hundred and fifty two acres of land part of the plantation on which I now live the South and west side of said plantation beginning on the line of the land granted to Joseph Orr Dec. thence running between the buildings of said Son and a piece of cleared land between my said Son's house and my own and leaving my Orchard Barn and two fields of cleared land on the east and north of my cleared land are left out of the land which I bequeath to my said Son with this proviso that he is to allow my daughter Peggy Montgomery privilege of cutting timber for rails to make sufficient fencing the part of the plantation that I bequeath to my said daughter Peggy Montgomery also bequeath to my said Son
