

I Henry Robman of the County of Franklin and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and memory acknowledging in view the uncertainty of life to make and ordain this my last Will and Testament and hereby revoking all other Wills by me heretofore made: 1st I devise to my wife Elizabeth Robman and her heirs forever the tract of land with the appurtenances on which I now live lying in the County of Franklin State of Tennessee containing about one hundred and fifteen acres. 2^d I give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Robman her Executors administrators and assigns forever all my personal goods chattels hereby intending to bequeath to her all my personal estate of every kind and description. That I do give of which I myself possessed I hereby nominate and appoint the said Elizabeth Robman the Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Eighth day of September A.D. Eighteen Hundred and Thirty (1830)

 State of Alabama } In the name of God Amen; I Robert J. Hawsens
 Morgan County } being of sound mind and memory but being laboring
 with a weak and failing memory and knowing the uncertainty of death do solemnly make and publish and declare this my last Will and Testament. First It is my Will that and desire that all my just debts be paid and in the furtherance of that object I authorize and empower my Executor in Alabama as hereafter appointed to sell all my perishable property in Alabama of every description that is my horse and only excepted what I wish reserved for my

for the purpose of conveying my wife to her relation in Tennessee
 also authorize and empower my said Executor in Alabama
 to collect and receipt for all monies due to me or which
 may hereafter become due and owing to me within the State of
 Alabama out of which monies I am owing from the sale
 of my perishable property aforesaid and so collected from debts
 now due or hereafter to be come due to me to pay first all my
 just debts as aforesaid and the residue of the monies arising from
 such sale or so collected by him. It is my wish that and
 desire that my Executor in Alabama should pay the same
 over to my wife Katharine Lewis whose receipt shall be a
 good voucher to him for the same. He willy. It is my will
 and desire that my Executor residing in Tennessee as
 hereafter appointed shall sell all my perishable prop. in
 the State of Tennessee as also the Borch which I now have in
 Alabama and which I have before received from a sale in
 Alabama retaining only my horse from sale. It is reserved
 to convey my wife to Tennessee in the Borch and out of the
 monies arising from such sales to pay my debts in the State
 of Tennessee. And the residue of the monies if any to pay over
 to my wife Katharine Lewis. I chose the Bore of Col James
 Lewis of Tennessee for a title to three hundred acres of land
 in Franklin County Tennessee. This equitable title I gave
 and bequeath to my children by my first wife with Mary
 Amanda and Eliza Lewis, share and share alike in fee
 simple. I gave and by word to my wife Katharine Lewis
 my horse herebefore received from sale also all the
 residue of monies which may be in the hands of the
 Executor after the payment of my debts and I also give and
 bequeath to my said wife Katharine during her natural life
 the equitable title which I have to three hundred acres
 of land in Franklin County Tennessee for which I hold the
 title bond of Thelie J Lewis and at her death I bequeath the
 said land to my son William Lewis his heirs or assigns
 if he dies without issue in fee simple to my three daughters
 Mary Amanda and Eliza or the survivor or survivors of them share
 and share alike or in the event of the death of either of them
 leaving him or their body then the part entitled to be conveyed
 to the Mother to be and become the property of his heirs. It is my
 will and desire that Henry Bull shall act as Executor of this
 will in Alabama and that William Stewart of Franklin County
 Tennessee shall act as my Executor in Tennessee. In Testimony

 of the third page one the words die without issue inserted

I give to my wife Rebecca Rich five beds and furniture all of my household furniture all kitchen furniture all of my plantation utensils I give her my Wagon and one yoke of Oxen I give her my land and plantation. I give her two choice horses I give her my stock of cattle hogs and sheep all of my negroes and their increase except my negro man George which is to be sold and the money arising from his sale to be applied here after directed. It is my wish and will that my wife shall have a choice negro girl of those negroes except George to wait on her in her old age or during her widowhood or during her life time or remain a widow there as I have by deed conveyed my present wife five sons one daughter with James Rich Pastor
