Will of William Brooks

In the name of God amen I William Brooks of the county of Henry State of Tennessee Calling to mind the uncertainty of life and believing it my incumbent duty to point out the manner in which I desire the arrangement of my worldly affairs do hereby make my last will and testament revoking all and every other will or disposition of my property hitherto made - And first it is my will and desire that all my just debts of every description shall be paid & for the purpose of raising a fund for meeting them I desire it to be the election of my beloved wife Elizabeth to point out such of the personal property as I may leave & sell the same at public sale to meet all just claims

It is my will and desire that my children & family of Blacks shall be kept together and all be under the care controul & management of my beloved whom I enjoin to educate our children in the best manner she may be enabled to do from the funds left her and as they may arrive at the age of twenty one years it is my will and desire that an equal portion of the estate liable to distribution to be paid to my child thus coming of age & to each as they may respectively come of age

There is in the possession of James H. Watkins my Wifes brother the sum of three hundred & ninety dollars in cash deposited with him as an indemnity for being my security to Jefferson Alexander. This money is also to be subject to the payment of my debts if necessary and to be properly & fully accounted for in the final adjustment of my affairs it is finally my will & desire that my beloved wife Elizabeth and her Brother James H. Watkins shall be the executors to this my last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 17th day of March 1835 Wm. Brooks

Cooney administrator of J. C. Hamilton decd
find that upon a former settlement
by B. C. Brown, John Gibbs &
John Atkins on the 5th July 1835
the amt due the administrator was
found to be one hundred & twenty two dollars and
fifty three cents that the interest on the
same up to this time is thirty seven dollars
& fifty cents. That he has recd since
that time one hundred & six dollars
and has paid out one hundred & eleven
& fifty eight cts on which last amt
we have allowed him a commission of
five per cent making five dollars & 51 cts
which leaves a balance due the adm
